The Urgent Call to Repentance

3rd Sunday of Lent 20 Mar 2022

Ex 3:1-8, 13-15 1 Cor 10:1-6, 10-12 Lk 13:1-9

As the Israelites were journeying towards the Promised Land, God displayed his remarkable love and incredible power for Israel such as holding up the walls of the Red Sea so that they could pass through dry ground (cf. Ex 14:21 - 31), miraculous provision of food and drinks while they were in the wilderness (cf. Ex 16:35 and 17:6), providing shelter through the cloud that overshadowed them (cf. Ex 13:21 - 22). Yet, in the midst of all these spiritual blessings. the Israelites were not contented with what they had been blessed with, they remained complacent, and grumbled. Eventually they were struck down in the desert even before they reached the Promised Land. This was to serve as an example and warning for ages to come, thus a reminder that we should not be too overconfident that we will not fall.

In today's Gospel, Jesus calls us to repentance through two calamities that had been subjects of recent conversation around the local watering hole of his day. One - an instance of state-sanctioned terror while the other, a random accident. These two occurrences lead us to realize how precarious our existence is. Neither of the victims did anything wrong, nothing could have caused their demise. When an unfortunate event occurs especially to good people, we always question God why good people suffer. Sometimes we mistake our good fortune as evidence of God's special blessing. However, the point Jesus highlights does not give us the opportunity to challenge God's management of the universe. Rather he is emphasising the call for repentance for all mankind. Life's fragility demands urgency and urgency shows that life itself has carved out opportunities for us to seize God's graciousness.

Similar to Jesus' description of the unexpected collapse of the tower of Siloam that crushed eighteen people, no one could have ever imagined that there would be such a long-drawn global pandemic or that Russia would invade Ukraine. Despite these two major calamities, our loving Father is not deaf to the pains and sufferings that we are going through and in fact, he is very close to the broken hearted. lust as he has reached out to the Israelites through Moses, our Father poured out his heart to Moses that "[he] has witnessed the affliction of [his] people in Egypt and have heard

(cf., Ex. 3: 7 – 8), the outpouring of charity and generosity we see in the pandemic and the Ukranian refugee crisis gives us hope that God's grace will continue to move hearts.

Likewise, our loving Father is reaching out to us in another way. Through the Holy Father, our loving God is reaching out to us through the Synod

out to us in another way. Through the Holy Father, our loving God is reaching out to us through the Synod of Synodality. Pope Francis has initiated a two-year period of hearing everyone's voice without judgement. Regardless of whether a Catholic is active or not, all baptised Catholics are invited to participate in the synodal process where Catholic voices can be heard. We are all invited to participate in this process to contribute to the Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation which will emerge from this Synod.

As the Church continues to listen to her people, she responds with unconditional love in the hope of leading the People of God to repentance. God's unconditional love remains to give his children additional time - time of mercy - before the imminent judgement. There is still hope in a cultivated yet unproductive tree as they may live without bearing fruit, only because it has been granted additional time to do what it is supposed to do. Unless it begins to bear fruit (an image of repentance, according to Luke 3:8), the result will be its just and swift destruction. Jesus' tone of the parable in today's Gospel emphasizes that his patience and mercy temporarily keeps judgement at bay. Let us heed the words of the Divine Mercy, "Before I come as the Just Judge, I first open wide the door of My Mercy. He who refuses to pass through the door of My Mercy must pass through the door of my Justice..." ~ Saint Faustina's Diary, 1146.

RCIA - Rite of Election 2022

On 6 March, 20 catechumens and four candidates, together with their respective godparents and sponsors, participated in the ceremony of the Rite of Election (ROE).

What is Rite of Election?

The ROE is a diocesan-wide celebration of catechumens during the first weekend of Lent. Led by the Archbishop, it welcomes the catechumens into the large Catholic Church made up of many parishes, as well as a final bid to get them "enrolled" for Baptism.

Due to the COVID pandemic, each parish celebrated the ROE in their respective churches. Upon the testimony of their godparents, the Catechumens then enrolled their names in the Book of Elect as a pledge of fidelity. Thereafter, the priest declared the catechumens to be members of the elect. Intercessions were also prayed for the elects and candidates to conclude the rite.

After the ROE comes three Scrutinies: Rites for self-searching and repentance to deliver the elects from the power of sin and Satan, protect them against temptation, and give them strength in Christ, presentations of the Creed and Lord's Prayer. This period concludes with the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist).
