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# The Parable of the Two **Brothers and the Good Father**

4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent 27 Mar 2022

los 5:9-12 2 Cor 5:17-21 Lk 15:1-3, 11-32

The story that Jesus tells in this Sunday's gospel is often called 'The Parable of the Prodigal Son'. Several Christian thinkers have also expounded on how the elder son reacts and is portrayed in the text. But there is a third protagonist: the good father. Let us examine each of these characters in turn.

The parable begins with the younger son asking his father for his share of the estate. In Jewish law, a father's property passes to his sons only after his death. In other words, the younger son's request was akin to asking his father to die.

He then travels to a distant country and squanders his property. In Jesus of Nazareth: From the Baptism in the Jordan to the Transfiguration, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI points out that the Greek word used for 'property' also means 'essence' in Greek philosophy. In losing what he has received from his father, the younger son has dissipated the 'essence' of himself.

He ends up working for a local inhabitant who tasks him to feed the pigs, which were considered unclean by Jews. In other words, the younger son was working for a Gentile. The loss of identity is thus complete: not only has the younger son severed his



relationship with his father, he has also lost his link to his community.

But he "came to his senses". Deep within himself, he finds an inner compass pointing towards the father, towards "the freedom of a 'son", as Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI puts it. He therefore went back to his father, and they celebrated, for "he was lost and is (now) found".

The elder son, however, knows nothing of wanderings and inner transformations. Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI puts it starkly: "He sees only injustice." And this resentment reveals that the elder son too has lost his way and his identity - he has been unaware of the grace of being at home, of the freedom that he enjoyed as a son of the father.

Consider also the context of this parable: Jesus was speaking to both the tax collectors and sinners, as well as the Pharisees and scribes. For the Jews, their relationship with God is a juridical one, above all else. The Law was paramount, and it was in their fidelity to the commandments that their 'righteousness' was expressed. In the character of the elder son, Jesus was therefore also addressing those who had never left home, for they, too, were in need of conversion.

The parable leaves uncertain whether

the elder son heeded his father's "plea". But what is certain is the heart of the father. In The Return of the Prodigal Son, Father Henri Nouwen writes that "the father's unreserved, unlimited love is offered wholly and equally to both his sons".

First, even when the younger son was still a long way off, the father "ran" to him. In those times, men would need to pull up the hem of their robes to run, revealing their bare legs, which was considered shameful. The father's love outweighed such petty concerns. Second, the father clothes the prodigal son with his "best robe". Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI interprets this as a restoration of "the lost robe of grace with which man had been originally clothed, but which he forfeited by sin". Third, in response to the elder son's bitterness, his father reaffirms his sonship and fidelity: "My son, you are with me always and all I have is yours."

As we head deeper into this season of Lent, let us reflect on who we are as children of God - whether the prodigal or elder child - all in need of conversion. But more importantly, let us remember the goodness of our Father. As Nouwen puts it, "Whether I am the younger son or the elder son, God's only desire is to bring me home."




