Jesus, The Last Word


Easter Sunday of The Lord's Resurrection 17 Apr 2022

Ac 10:34, 37-43 1 Cor 5:6-8 Jn 20:1-9

Easter celebrates Jesus' resurrection. However, in today's gospel reading, the text does not feature Jesus at all. Instead there is a focus on the disappearance of our central character and the experience of emptiness.

Firstly, we see how Mary Magdalene, being the first who saw that the stone was moved, assumed the body had been stolen. She ran and alerted Simon Peter and the beloved John. Next, we see both disciples rushing down to the tomb. Although John outran Peter, it was Peter in his characteristic rashness who entered the tomb first. In contrast, John who arrived first, had some time to contemplate the opened tomb before following Peter in. The Gospel says, even though "they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead", only John "saw and believed." (Jn 20:9-10)

When something life changing turns our whole world upside down, are we more like Mary Magdalene, Simon Peter, or John? For those of us who have experienced a devastating event in our lives — receiving a cancer diagnosis, losing a life partner, being retrenched—what is our response to God? Do we rush to find meaning and jump to certain conclusions? Do we instinctively get angry and reject even

comfort and care? Do we take a long time to mull and replay the events in our head over and over again?

This is not a comparison to determine who was the greatest disciple and what is the ideal or perfect response to a devastating event. Rather, we see how Jesus continues to pursue his disciples each in their own way in the aftermath. We think of doubting Thomas and the two disciples on the way to Emmaus. "By means of touch and the sharing of a meal, the risen Jesus establishes direct contact with his disciples. He invites them in this way to recognise that he is not a ghost and above all to verify that the risen body in which he appears to them is the same body that had been tortured and crucified, for it still bears the traces of his Passion." (CCC645)

In the continuation from today's gospel text, we also see how the risen Jesus appeared to Mary Magdalene when she remained behind and lingered in her grief at the entrance of the tomb. When Jesus called her by name, she recognised him at once. "This authentic, real body possesses the new properties of a glorious body: not limited by space and time but able to be present how and when he wills...in the guise of a gardener or in other forms familiar to his

disciples." He does this "precisely to awaken their faith." (CCC645)

As St Paul says, "if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain... But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death." (1 Cor 15:14; 2 0-22, 24-26)

Indeed, the story does not end with emptiness; death does not have the last word. By his Resurrection, Jesus opens for us the way to a new life. The paschal mystery is made manifest in our lives when we allow our relationship with God to transform and evolve as we are assailed by afflictions of all kinds. Can we open our hearts once more to God's pursuit of us in the wake of devastation? Can we allow our faith to be awakened by Jesus' glorious victory?




