On Trust and Mercy

Divine Mercy Sunday 24 Apr 2022

Ac 5:12-16 Rev 1:9-13, 17-19 Jn 20:19-31

It is the season for miracles. All three readings for this Sunday testify to the Risen Christ and his power.

The First Reading depicts the growth of the early Christian community in the days just after the Resurrection, with "signs and wonders...worked among people" and "the numbers of men and women who came to believe in the Lord increase[ing] steadily". In the Second Reading, the apostle John describes his vision of "a figure like a Son of man" who declares that he is "the First and the Last" and "the Living One". In the Gospel, our Resurrected Lord appears in the flesh to his disciples in a locked room.

And yet, with these miracles and testimonies, there are those who did not believe. The example of Thomas is striking. Here was one of the Twelve who had lived with Jesus, witnessed his wonders first-hand, and heard his prophecies in person. Yet, when he was told that Jesus was alive, he did not believe, even though Jesus himself had proclaimed that he would rise from the dead in three days.

The problem then, is not that Thomas did not believe *in Jesus*, but he did not believe *Jesus himself*.

As CS Lewis wrote in his essay, On Obstinacy in Belief, "Our relation to those who trusted us only after we were proved innocent in court cannot be the same as our relation to those who trusted us all through."

Thomas' conversion is thus accompanied by a fundamental change in his relationship with Jesus. For Thomas, no longer is Jesus merely "Master" or "Rabbi"; Jesus is "my Lord and my God".

In this context, the Gospel reading's famous line – "Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe" – is especially addressed to those of us who profess to be Christians but do not live in a way that professes Christ as our Risen Lord. We still place our identity in the things of this world, we hoard our material wealth, and we rely on ourselves. Like Thomas, we know Christ, but we do not trust in him.

St Faustina Kowalska therefore taught us to say, "Jesus, I trust in you." A Polish nun, St Faustina received a vision of Jesus in 1931. He was clothed in white, and two large rays – one red and one pale – emanated from his body. Jesus explained to her that the two rays denoted blood and water, just as how blood and water gushed forth when his side was pierced by the lance of the centurion as he hung on the cross – the same side that Jesus asked Thomas to touch so that he might believe.

This vision would eventually become the image of the Divine Mercy and the icon of our trust in the Lord's unfathomable mercy and grace to save us from our sins. Following the growth of Catholic

devotion to the Divine Mercy, St Faustina was eventually canonized by Pope St John Paul II in April 2000. And a year later in April 2001, Pope St John Paul II established the Feast of the Divine Mercy, emphasizing Jesus' message to St Faustina in the Easter context: "Humanity will never find peace until it turns with trust to Divine Mercy... This is the Easter gift that the Church receives from the risen Christ and offers to humanity at the dawn of the third millennium."

As we continue to celebrate Eastertide, let us renew our relationship with the Risen Lord and trust ever more in his grace and mercy in our lives.

On this holy night, the high point of the Easter triduum, the Church keeps watch, celebrating the resurrection of Christ and awaiting his return in glory.


