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The Anamnesis of Christ's Love

Good Shepherd Sunday World Day of Prayer for Vocations 8 May 2022

Ac 13:14, 43-52 Rev 7:9, 14b-17 In 10:27-30

Apocalyptic literature like Revelation puts us into a "time-lapse" where the past, present and future are immediately before us for contemplation, participation and decisive response. The bible scholar, Etienne Charpentier, calls apocalyptic writings "a theology in images" (How to Read the Old Testament, p90). The images are deliberately esoteric only those initiated into the faith recognise them, grasp their meaning and even receive power from them.

For all of us who are baptised, have frequented the sacraments and are persevering in prayer and study, the symbolism in today's passage from Revelation would be clear: the white robes signify victory or purity; the blood of the Lamb is the blood of Christ poured out from the cross as the atonement for humanity's sin; the tent of "the One" spread over the multitudes is Christ's eternal presence; the Lamb is Christ - "slain, yet lives to reign" (Easter Sequence), and the sheep are his people - those who belong to Christ for they listen to his voice [daily in the scriptures] and follow him (Jn 10:27 - today's gospel).

When John wrote Revelation, Christians were facing intense persecution under Roman Emperor Domitian (reigned 81-96AD). Domitian had killed his own brother, Titus, in order to take the throne. Now enthroned, he wanted to be

called "God the Lord." Needless to say, many Christians refused to say "Caesar kurios" ("Caesar is lord") in the public squares. They were therefore executed or exiled. John himself was exiled to Patmos and his gospel, the letters and Revelation were all written from there.

John's Revelation was an *anamnesis* for the persecuted Christians. He was not simply offering them words of encouragement. In recalling their sharing in the heavenly liturgy through the breaking of bread (eucharist), the persecuted Christians knew Christ was truly with them in their persecution. He was not distant from them on his throne in heaven now that he had ascended. He was right beside each and every single one of them as the shepherd carrying his beloved sheep to living water (Rev 7:17).

The Greek word anamnesis is translated as memorial or recollection. It does not refer to a mere mental recall of past events at an intellectual level. Rather, it refers to a drawing from the shared memory of God's entire saving plan already actuated by Christ. We are able to share in God's memory because in baptism, we have been grafted into the life of the Trinity. This life is nourished in every eucharist where Christ brings to us his passion, death, resurrection and ascension on the altar so that we may remain with him, like our Blessed Mother, from the Upper Room, to the crucifixion and then witness his resurrection and ascension. That is why we are

able to acclaim, "Christ has died, Christ is risen..." It is because Christ re-presented his sacrifice for us in an unbloody manner at the altar and enabled us to participate in his sacrifice by accepting our own trials, that we have remained with him and ministered to him. Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI says that the more we live in the "fear of the Lord," actively seeking out God's will, "the more concretely and clearly effective this anamnesis becomes." (Conscience and Truth, Feb 1991) God has enabled us to "visit the future" by giving us a foretaste of heaven in the eucharist. We now have a "memory of the future" and our whole life must be in some way "a liturgy, an anamnesis, an eternal memory of the Easter of Christ." (Festival of the Social Doctrine of the Church, 26 Nov 2020)

There is such a radical power in having truly accompanied Christ in his passion that Jesuit theologian Bruce T. Morill titled his study of the eucharist "Anamnesis as Dangerous Memory." It is "dangerous" because it "not only inspires but demands action in the world...in its unique keeping of time, the liturgy reveals the kingdom of God and empowers believers thus to witness to it."

As we look upon Jesus in our hands at Holy Communion today, let us ask our Good Shepherd who has loved us to his death how we can better respond and witness to his love, "Give us the courage, dear Jesus, to follow you and say, 'Father, not my will, but yours be done." (Lk 22:42)

Parish Retreat: Journey Home To The Heart Of God

Has Covid left you wandering in the wilderness - adrift, alone, dry and disconnected? Fifty-three participants answered the Lord's invitation to spend a weekend with Him at the recent Parish Retreat which was run in collaboration with Catholic Spirituality Centre. We praise and thank the Lord for calling us to come and be refreshed, restored and renewed.

"Though the retreat was targeted at those who have not been going to church since the pandemic, I signed up as I was feeling overwhelmed and tired. Very quickly at the start of the retreat, it became apparent why I was called. Though active in ministries and service in church, I had forgotten the purpose of what or rather who I am doing it for. I was so drained from the doing that I had little or no energy left to bond or build my relationship with God. I needed a restart button to rebuild my spiritual life. Practical tips were shared by the retreat master on how to get that going. Through the praise and worship, session inputs and paraliturgies, I was reminded repeatedly and felt thoroughly loved by God. I left the retreat feeling positive, rejuvenated and more equipped in getting to know my Lord again. And how else better to start than through a commitment to daily prayer and scripture. I know it's still a journey and I may never always understand God's promptings, but I'm filled with hope and courage, knowing His plans for me will always be the right ones, in his time.
