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## Three in One

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity 12 Jun 2022

Prov 8:22-31 Rom 5:1-5 Jn 16:12-15

In one of his articles on the mystery of the Holy Trinity, Fr Ronald Rolheiser gives a brief history of religion. From early on in our human history, people have always had experiences of the divine and transcendental that have moved them to worship him. However, they had the sense that God is too rich to be captured by any one human concept. "Hence, peoples ancient were most polytheistic; they believed in many gods and goddesses." These gods and goddesses spoke to "every longing and every circumstance, from war, growing crops, to sex, and understanding why your father wouldn't bless you." Furthermore, these peoples sometimes perceived gods and goddesses to have dramatic existence, fighting а among themselves and meddling in human affairs.

In the Old Testament, we see that the Jews were an exception. They proclaimed that there was only one Almighty God, and no other like Him. After the resurrection of Jesus however, the early Christians started to encounter problems with simple monotheism. "When Jesus rose from the dead, Christians immediately began to attribute divinity to him, yet without identifying him as God the Father. lesus was understood to be God. but somehow different from God the Father. Moreover, inside of their experience, they sensed still a third divine energy which they couldn't

fully identify with either Jesus or God the Father — [which is] the Holy Spirit." It took a few centuries of theological disputes and rebutting of heresies before the Church could articulate the trinitarian formula of three divine persons in one God.

In his book "Mere Christianity", CS Lewis distinguishes between making and begetting. When you make something, you are producing something that is outside of yourself, something that is not of your own nature, for example, a man making a pot from moulding some clay; a pot is substantially different from a man. However, when you beget something, you create something of yourself, such as a man begetting a child; both are of the same human nature. Similarly, as God the Father begets Jesus the Son, both are of the same divine nature.

Lewis continues, "What grows out of the joint life of the Father and the Son is in fact the third of the three Persons who are God... Do not be worried or surprised if you find Him rather vague or more shadowy in your mind than the other two. In the Christian life you are not usually looking at Him. He is always acting through you. If you think of the Father as something 'out there', in front of you, and of the Son as someone standing at your side, helping you to pray, trying to turn you into another son, then you have to think of the third Person as something inside you, or behind you."

This is how God takes us up into his divine life. When we allow the Holy Spirit to act in us and through us, speaking the language of love in our every thought, word and deed, God's divinity within us flourishes. This is echoed in the Gospel reading where Jesus said, "...when the Spirit of truth comes, he will lead you to complete truth... Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said: All he tells you will be taken from what is mine." In this, we sense the unity and interrelationship between all three divine persons, as well as the invitation given to us to join ourselves to them.

In our wrestling with theological concepts, Fr Rolheiser exhorts us to humility. In the end, "no formula can ever [fully] capture the reality of God... All of us need to be more humble in our language about God. The idea of God needs to stretch, not shrink, the human imagination." May the trinitarian doctrine open our hearts to the workings of the richness of God within us, and not chain us to rigid ideas of who we think God should be.
