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Prayer -**A Relationship**

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time 24 July 2022

Gen 18:20-32 Col 2: 12-14 Lk 11:1-13

While praying petitions can help us weather the storms of life, God often calls us to something deeper in prayers.

St John Damascene describes prayers as "the raising of one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God." In Jesus, life was prayer & prayer was life. He prayed early in the morning, often the whole night, before and after great events, and especially when life was unusually busy. Prayer is a living relationship with God.

Jesus leads us progressively toward the Father in the Lord's Prayer. (CCC 2786 - 2865) Also called the "Our Father", the prayer denotes foremost a familial relationship between God as Father and we as his adopted children. It develops in us the will to become like him and fosters a humble and trusting heart.

"In the Our Father, the object of the first three petitions is the glory of the Father: the sanctification of his name, the coming of the kingdom, and the fulfilment of his will. The four others present our wants to him: they ask that our lives be nourished, healed of sin, and made victorious in the struggle of good over evil." (CCC 2857) - long version of the Lord's Prayer (Mt 6:9-13).

The Lord's Prayer is not just a prayer but also a framework and attitude for praying. St Thomas Aquinas explains: "The Lord's Prayer is the *most perfect of prayers* . . . *This prayer*



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not only teaches us to ask for things, but also in what order we should *desire them.*" However, when prayers are not answered, we are reminded that God is not an instrument to be used, but a provider for what is good for us (CCC 2735-36).

Words alone are not sufficient for prayers - the Holy Spirit is needed (CCC2766). In the parable of the persistent friend, Jesus wants us to pray more relentlessly for the gift of the Holy Spirit than for the necessities of life. Prioritising holiness is a call to trust in the Father's care (Phil 4:6). This is not an excuse for laziness in practical matters (2 Th 3:6-13). So if we ask the Father for the Holy Spirit, he's not going to deny us, just as an earthly father would not deny his child's request for bread, a fish or an egg. (Lk 11:13). Also important is the manner in which we intercede. We are not merely to recite petitions but to pray relentlessly, persistently and even desperately - like the friend in the parable who pounds on the door until he gets some bread.

We see in the 1st Reading, the same audacity and persistency in the intercession of Abraham. Tempered with humility, Abraham lowers himself: "I who am but dust and ashes." (Gen 18:27), before bartering with God to spare Sodom from destruction, if 50, then 40, ... and finally 10 righteous men can be found. Abraham's prayer is a model for persistent, humble prayer of intercession.

"Lord, teach us to pray" (Lk 11:1) is more a question of imitation than a request for another vocal prayer. Jesus does not give us a formula to repeat mechanically (Mt 6:7) in praying, we should meditate and contemplate.

In the "Interior Castle", St. Teresa of Avila, Doctor of the Church describes (Prayer), meditation

as an attentive reflection using scripture (Our Father qualifies) or other spiritual reading as a conversation starter to discern and respond to the Lord's prompting. This leads to contemplation - a supernatural prayer. Here, God takes the impetus - he captivates the mind, body and soul as they progressively surrendered. are Contemplation culminates in a trance-like simple gaze of faith, fixed on Jesus. St John Vianney, patron saint of parish priests describes his experience: "I look at him and he looks at me."

Spiritual theologian Fr Jordan Aumann explains that in contemplation, God re-makes us in his image and likeness. We are literally being deified by God and beginning to participate more and more in his divine nature (2 Pe 1:4). supercharged relationship This with God empowers love and relationship with others.

"The closer one approaches to God, the simpler one becomes." (St Therese of Lisieux)

Spend more time in Eucharistic adoration. Contemplate on the Lord. When you lose your life, you will find it (Mt 10:39).






