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Choose Salvation

21st Sunday in Ordinary Time Lay Apostolate Sunday 21 Aug 2022

ls 66:18-21 Hebr 12:5-7, 11-13 Lk 13:22-30

"Sir, will there only be a few saved?" (Lk 13:23), someone asked Jesus while he was making his way to Jerusalem. Isn't that a question we would all like to have an answer to? Perhaps in many of our hearts, the more pertinent question we really want answered is "Sir, will I be saved?"

Elsewhere in Scripture, God reveals that he "desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth." (1 Tim 2:4) And God's actions confirm his word when he "gave his only-begotten Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." (Jn 3:16) Jesus, Son of God, through his sacrifice on the cross became an expiation for our sins and the sins of the whole world (1 In 2:2) and by his Ascension, draws all man to himself. (In 12:32) Jesus also tells us "Ask, and it will be given you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened." (Lk 11:9) In light of all these truths, it becomes clear that God has offered to everyone every grace necessary and more, to enter into eternal bliss in Heaven. What then are we to make of lesus' answer, that "many will try to enter [the Kingdom of Heaven] and will not succeed" (Lk 13:24)?

Jesus does not sugar coat the fact that entering the kingdom of God will require our best efforts! In the face of God's grace of salvation, we are called to respond with the obedience of faith to the teachings of Jesus Christ. (Rm 1:5) Although we eat and drink Jesus himself in the Eucharist at every Mass, and listen to him teach us through his Priests, Jesus could still say "I do not know where you come from." (cf Lk 13:25-27) Simply coming to Mass every Sunday may not be enough if our lives do not change.

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It is true that there are many who truly and sincerely believe in Jesus Christ and are baptised. But sadly, far too many do not lead Christian lives, who on a daily basis do things that are grievously abhorrent in the sight of God. Far too many are self-satisfied in having performed the outward observances of religion but who conduct their lives in a manner that is not well pleasing to God. These are those who say "Lord, Lord" but do not do the will of the Father in Heaven (Mt 7:21) And when their time on earth is over and the door to heaven is shut, Jesus will say to them, "I do not know where you come from; away from me, all evil doers!" (Lk 13:27)

We do not want to be "practicing Catholics" with whom God is not well pleased. God hates envy, immorality, selfishness, impurity, anger, dishonesty. He calls us and gives sufficient graces to live a Christian life. Most of all, God wants us to be chaste, kind and true to our profession of faith. It is a tall order, but the second reading today also gives us hope. When we falter in our Christian lives and are at risk of turning away from it, God's love will discipline and reprimand us to get us back on track. The reprimand may be most painful at the time and far from pleasant, but "suffering produces endurance endurance, and produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us." (Rm 5:3-5) In the end, the disciplining from God will bear fruit in peace and righteousness to those who have been trained by it. (Hebr 12:11)

On this Lay Apostolate Sunday, we are reminded of our duty to go out and spread the Kingdom of God to our fellow men. However, we are also reminded to regularly examine our conscience and give our best efforts to practice our Catholic faith at home, at work, with our relatives, our friends and our enemies. When we fail to do so, we must repent because simply going to Mass does not entitle us to Heaven. Let us pray that God will grant us perseverance to the end.

ELAINE YEO, L4 catechist *Why be a catechist?*

It was partly because I wanted to journey with my son. At the same time, I felt drawn to do more than attend Mass on Sunday, so serving in the catechetical ministry was a natural choice.
