All or nothing: the cost of discipleship

23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time 4 Sep 2022

Wis 9:13-18 Phm 9-10, 12-17 Lk 14:25-33

In this Sunday's gospel reading, we are confronted with the cost of discipleship and what saying yes to the Lord truly means. Jesus very soberly commands that anyone who does not hate their loved ones and themselves, cannot be his disciple. When we hear this, what feelings stir up within us? Does it seem unreasonable for Jesus to ask this of us? This certainly is one of Jesus' most challenging commands to grapple with. Just as we hear in the first reading, "who can divine the will of the Lord?", how do we reconcile these words with what Jesus says earlier in Luke 10:27, telling us to love our neighbour as ourselves?

In trying to understand lesus' words, it may be tempting to assume, that perhaps the Greek word for "hate" (the language of Luke's gospel) was mistranslated. Perhaps Jesus meant something else and that "hate" is different to our contemporary understanding? While promising, scholarship reveals that the word that Jesus uses in the gospel, miseo, is the same as what we would use now to mean hate, a preferential type of response. Therefore, Jesus' words are as serious as they sound. If so, how then do we understand Jesus' command?

Biblical scholarship has examined Jesus as a teacher. He often used hyperbole as a tool for teaching.

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This method of exaggeration may at times, shock and cause discomfort in students, however, it also stimulates creativity, aiding students' memory of what is taught. In using hyperbole, Jesus therefore does not contradict himself. Instead, he expresses his desire that we belong completely to him and simultaneously reveals his identity as God. How do we know this? At pride of place in every Jew's mind is the Shema - the key prayer in Judaism prayed throughout the day. The opening of this prayer are the words from Deuteronomy 6:5, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might." This command given by Moses to the Israelites presents to us that we have to love God with our entire being and effort.

It is impossible to love the Lord with all of our being if we place others above him. Therefore, we have to intentionally choose to put the Lord first in our lives if we wish to follow him. Jesus is not telling us to stop caring for our families and those whom we love. Instead, he commands that our hearts must first belong to him. Jesus is God, and in this command, he reminds his disciples of his true identity while also cautioning them that this is what they choose, when they say yes to becoming his disciple. Before we say yes, Jesus reminds us that we have to count the cost. Can we say yes to this command?

God has given himself completely to us. We receive the Father, Son and Spirit as gifts and the Lord invites us to give of ourselves too, in love. How do we respond to this invitation? Every time we partake of the Eucharist, the priest offers up the sacrifice of Christ's body on our behalf. However, we are also invited to offer up our own offering - that of ourselves, united with Christ. Therefore, every time we receive the Holy Eucharist, we should remember that we are saying yes to giving of ourselves to the Lord. This disposition helps us to receive the body of Christ with an open heart, preparing us to give of ourselves to him again and again.

We must also reflect on how we use our time. Do we spend time listening to the Lord in prayer? Or do we skip prayer time because we are busy pampering or indulging our loved ones? Do we act in ways which glorify the Lord? The Lord must come first in all things. Just as we love the people around us, our love for the Lord must be the centre of every word, thought and deed that comes forth from us. This is the cost of discipleship, our entire lives freely given up to the Lord.
