Stinginess Dishonours God

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time
18 Sep 2022

Am 8:4-7
1 Tim 2:1-8
Lk 16:1-13

Not progressing in holiness? It may be due to one's attitude towards money and its use. Pope Francis observes: *"Riches have the ability to seduce, [making] us believe that we are in a paradise on earth, [that] we are powerful like God."* (Homily at Chapel of Santa Marta, 25 May 2015).

In a world ruled by wealth, people are abused, money is loved, God is hated. (Lk 16:13). The ruthless merchants in the 1st Reading cheat the poor in Samaria *"by swindling and tampering with the scales."* (Am 8:5). God warns that even the smallest acts of cheating and economic injustice will be punished. (Am 8:7-14) The warning is ignored. Samaria falls under the mighty Assyrians.

But money is not evil. Paul dedicates two chapters (2 Cor 8-9) exclusively to the importance of money and generosity. In the Gospel, Jesus teaches - use money, love people. The parable of the cunning steward is a typology for almsgiving.

About to get fired, the steward "cooks the book" to find favour with his master's debtors and prepares for his future (Lk 16:6-7). This Jewish Robin Hood seems to force his master to make restitution for exploiting the poor. (Although Jews were forbidden to lend to Jews at interest, it was not uncommon that exorbitant interest was levied.) Money is "tainted" (Lk 16:9) when trade is carried out unjustly.

We are to emulate the steward's astuteness with money, not his cunningness in fraud. Giving alms to the poor is a work of justice pleasing to God. (CCC 2462) We are stewards of God's creation (CCC 952). Everything we own, including money, does not really belong to us. Spiritual astuteness in the use of money, surpasses earthly astuteness. The steward makes friends on earth, Christians make friends in heaven. (Lk 16:9) **Almsgiving** also bears a degree of **prayer** (of thanksgiving and gratitude) and a degree of **fasting** (of giving up something) - the three pillars of Christian praxis.

Astuteness extends to investments in proclaiming the Gospel and building God's kingdom. (2 Cor 9:6-15) Our generosity will be lavishly rewarded, outmatched by God's gifts and blessings. (Lk 6:38, 2 Cor 9:8,11) There is a strong link between giving and one's heavenly prosperity. For giving is a higher level of blessing than receiving. Jesus himself said: *"It is more blessed to give than to receive."* (Ac 20:35). Anecdotally, we can attest to it.


Herein lies a very important principle on the use of money - **What God is going to entrust to us spiritually**, in some way depends on what we do financially. When we are prudent in dealing with *"little things"* (money included), God blesses us with spiritual riches. (Lk 16:10-11) Stagnation in holiness could be due in part, to what is done, or not done with money. There are eschatological consequences too. In the ensuing parable of "The rich man & Lazarus", the rich man is condemned for his stinginess. (Lk 16:19-31)

Giving to God is sacred and proper to worship. This is often overlooked. For none shall come to worship God and celebrate, empty-handed. (Ex

23:15, Ps 96:8). Generosity honours God, stinginess dishonours God.

Parting with money is extremely difficult. We worked hard for it. There are always temptations of a bigger house, a nicer car ... The Christian view of money is harder to follow. Unlike Cain, we are our *"brother's keeper"*. (Gen 4:9). It is as G. K. Chesterton observed: *"The Christian ideal has not been tried and found wanting. It has been found difficult and left untried."* Have faith - when we seek first the kingdom of God (Mt 6:33), divine providence kicks in (Mt 6:25-34). Without God, we labour in vain. (Ps 127)

Generosity is a fruit of the Holy Spirit. God will bless us with enough for every good work. (2 Cor 9:7-8) Don't let money rule us, use it wisely. Live by the faith principle - give first, then receive. We ought to use our earthly wealth in helping the poor and investing in God's Kingdom. It paves our way to holiness for heavenly returns that are phenomenal and assured.




St Jerome Library Reopens!

Our parish library, St Jerome Library, which used to be at the Parish Centre, will re-open on **Sun 25 Sep, 8am – 1pm**, in its new location next to the Mt Tabor Adoration Room. St Jerome has been re-modelled as a boutique library-cum-exhibition space to cater to the voracious reader as well as the busy person looking to casually browse and be kept updated on what the Church is highlighting for our contemplation in her Solemnities and Feasts each month. St Jerome has over 700 books shelved under 10 collections including a “Popular Authors” shelf with writings by Pope Francis, Dr Scott Hahn, Bishop Robert Barron and Fr Henri Nouwen. Every month, a fresh mini exhibition of Christian art and tapestries, statuary and other archived materials is put up to showcase the Church’s rich heritage and spirituality. INFANT BAPTISM

Spiritual preparation is held on the last Friday of every odd month. Baptism is held on the first Sunday of the following month. For registration, please refer to our website.

Please check with the Parish Office for priest availability and Mass timing before confirming the timing at the crematorium. For prayers at the wake, please contact the Parish Office.



MARRIAGE

Contact the Parish Office 12 months before your intended date to book the church premises and ensure that your presiding priest is able to make that date.
