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Gratitude - An Antidote to Life


28th Sunday in Ordinary Time
9 Oct 2022

2 Kgs 5:14-17
2 Ti 2:8-13
Lk 17:11-19

"Remember Jesus Christ," (2 Ti 2:8 RSV) St. Paul begins our second reading by exhorting his spiritual son (2 Ti 2:1), Timothy. Do we remember Jesus? What do we remember of him? Perhaps our secular lives have been so exciting and our Christian lives so mundane that thoughts of Jesus are relegated to a far corner of our minds and all but banished from our hearts. Do we remember when we last truly worshipped God at Mass with all our hearts and all our souls; when we last got down on our knees and humbly gave thanks to God; or dedicated time to read Scripture?

We ought always to remember Jesus Christ.

We ought to remember that when we were baptised, by the grace of God, all our sins were forgiven. Baptism signifies our dying to sin and descent into the tomb with Christ. At Baptism, we were also reborn into new life in Jesus so that nothing remains. Neither Adam's sin, nor personal sin, nor the consequences of past sins would impede our entry into the Kingdom of God (CCC 628,1263). St. Paul said to Timothy, "if we have died with him, we shall also live with him" (2 Ti 2:11). Nothing that we have ever done, nor can do, will merit our re-birth into life with Christ, except by the grace of God through Christ. In gratitude, we ought to remember him.



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Jesus Christ.*

Having been born again to new spiritual life, Jesus sustains it by feeding us with spiritual food. This food is none other than the divinity of Christ himself in his body, blood and soul of which we partake every time we celebrate Mass in the Liturgy of the Eucharist. But although the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian lives (CCC 1324), our lives are seldom perfectly righteous. Much like the Israelites hankering after their previous lives of slavery in Egypt, the "stain" of Original Sin frequently pulls us back into sin even after Baptism. Sin wounds our spiritual life and at its gravest, separates us from God (CCC 1264, 1861). Thankfully, even when we are faithless, God is faithful (2 Ti 2:13) and provides the means to heal these wounds through the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Penance, which restores our spiritual lives to a right relationship with him. It was Jesus who established this Sacrament when he gave his Apostles the authority to forgive or retain sins on earth (Jn 20:23). In gratitude, we ought to give thanks and remember him.

By his life of obedience to God the Father, his death and resurrection, Christ merited for us the grace of eternal life with God. Therefore, our entire earthly life is nothing but time given by the grace of God for us to prepare for eternal life through the

obedience that springs from faith (Rm 1:5, 16:26) in what Jesus has accomplished. And at the end of our time on earth, even in death, there is a positive meaning because of Christ. "What is essentially new about Christian death is this: through Baptism, the Christian has already 'died with Christ' sacramentally, in order to live a new life; and if we die in Christ's grace, physical death completes this 'dying in Christ' and so completes our incorporation into him in his redeeming act." (CCC 1010) In gratitude, we ought to be comforted and remember him.

A disposition of gratitude for the grace and providence of God in every circumstance that life throws at us, is one which pleases God. Thus in our first reading Naaman, the great commander of the Syrian army worshipped God in gratitude for his healing through his "baptism" in the Jordan. In a similar way, the Samaritan leper in our gospel reading, returned to Jesus to worship him in gratitude. These expressions of gratitude through worship demonstrate faith in God and elicit the response from Jesus, "Stand up and go your way. Your faith has saved you." (Lk 17:19)

Let us always remember Jesus Christ, keep the faith and endure till the end; so that he will also say to us, "Rise, your faith has saved you!"

1st Sacrament of Reconciliation for L2

46 children from L2 participated in their first Reconciliation on 1 Oct 2022. Reconciliation being one of the 7 Sacraments, was an important occasion for the children who, for the first time, experienced its full meaning, including the examination of conscience, preparations for Confession and Penance. Parents were present throughout the session to encourage and journey with their children. Some children were initially afraid, not knowing if they would get scolded. Others were nervous to be speaking with the priests and uncertain as to what to say. However, with the guidance of the priests, parents and catechists, all went well. To mark this meaningful event, parents wrote letters to encourage their children. In addition to Reconciliation, the children also did craft work (A Joy of a Clean Heart).
