Suffering in Mission is Strengthened by Dwelling in His Presence

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time World Mission Day 23 Oct 2022

ls 2:1 – 5 Eph 3:2 – 12 Mk 16:15 – 20

In today's Gospel, Jesus mandated his disciples to "Go, make disciples of all nations..." (Mk 16:15) As missionary disciples, we constantly face trials and tribulations. There are days when we feel tired, unmotivated, hurt, rejected, confused and unappreciated. Missionary disciples, even after having encountered Jesus, can still fall away. In Lk 8:13, Jesus explained why there are some who fall away even though they have encountered his word, "Those on rocky ground are the ones who, when they hear, receive the word with joy, but they have no roots; they believe only for a time and fall away in times of trial."

How can we maintain our missionary zeal? Pope St Paul VI states that *"Evangelisation will never be possible without the action of the Holy Spirit."* We see in Lk 4:14 that it is *"in the power of the Spirit"* that Jesus returns to Galilee and begins his preaching at Nazareth. It is the Holy Spirit who inspires the words to use, who predisposes the hearer to be open and receptive to the Good News and to the kingdom being proclaimed. (cf *Evangelii Nuntiandi*, 75) As mere instruments, we need the Holy Spirit to work through and sustain us.

St Paul too is filled with the Holy Spirit before dedicating himself to his apostolic ministry. (Eph 3:7) In today's second reading, St Paul did not fall away but held firm to his faith,



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> despite imprisonment, probably house arrest in Rome (Ac 28:16), for preaching to the Gentiles. St Paul suffered tremendously for preaching "the inscrutable riches of Christ," (Eph 3:8) We can trace St Paul's deep faith to his deep conversion when he encountered Jesus on the road to Damascus. Like St Paul, we too can draw strength by recalling our own encounter with the Lord to invigorate us in times of struggle and lethargy. Like St Paul who was focused on his goal of evangelizing the Gentiles, we too can keep our eyes focused on the goal to keep us energised in our mission.

St Pio of Pietrelcina, whose feast we celebrated exactly a month ago, embarked on his mission by offering his suffering through his stigmata to remedy men's ingratitude. When Jesus appeared to St Pio, he said, "My son, do not think that my agony only lasted three hours, no; I will be in agony until the end of the world, on account of the souls whom I have most blessed... the ingratitude and the sleep of my ministers make my agony even more burdensome." (Padre Pio Under Investigation: The Secret Vatican Files, Chapter 2) St Pio was a very prayerful, holy Franciscan Capuchin friar, stigmatist and mystic who loved the Eucharist. Our evangelical zeal must spring from true holiness, nourished by prayer and above all by the love of the Eucharist.

As the Church celebrates World Mission Day, Pope Francis reiterates Pope St Paul VI who tells us that as missionary disciples, we are to be led by the Holy Spirit, who is the principal agent of evangelisation (cf Evangelii Nuntiandi, 75). In his message, our Holy Father wrote, "All Christ's missionary disciples are called to recognize the essential importance of the Spirit's work, to dwell in his presence daily and to receive his unfailing strength and guidance. Indeed, it is precisely when we feel tired, unmotivated, or confused that we should remember to have recourse to the Holy Spirit in prayer. Let me emphasize once again that prayer plays a fundamental role in the missionary life, for it allows us to be refreshed and strengthened by the Spirit as the inexhaustible divine source of renewed energy and joy in sharing Christ's life with others." (Message For World Mission Day 2022).

If our mission is not rooted in our relationship with Christ that is energised by the Holy Spirit, through a deep prayer life, Scripture, Magisterial Church Teachings, regular reception of the Sacraments and support afforded in communal life, it will not be surprising that when we are faced with scandals, hurts, betrayal, sufferings etc, we will fall away.

SFX's Fight with Covid-19

SFX wasn't hard hit in the early days of Covid-19. Life went on right up to the Circuit Breaker from 7 April to 1 June 2020. After which, only attending online masses was possible. Our spiritual life changed so much - from the daily availability of the Holy Eucharist to the total inability to receive Christ's body.

Only later in July 2020, did SFX reopen with 50pax Masses held in JPII Hall. With this limited capacity, it was a fastest-fingers-first rush to book yourself into a particular mass. Safety Management Officers were appointed to ensure people who came were actually registered for that particular Mass. It was sad to turn away parishioners/friends because they made booking errors. There was a need for use of the SafeEntry application to record one's visit to Church, for contact tracing purposes.

Later in September 2021, we could have 180pax (1m rule) vaccinated and 50pax unvaccinated Masses. Then, the TraceTogether application's usage started with parishioners needing to have the app/token verified with working Bluetooth so that close contacts could be easily traced. In the event where a





case was detected, precautionary notes from Fr Ben were shared on social media and people who were seated within 2.5m of the infected were also notified after their particulars were obtained from the Archdiocese Digital Team.

> In February 2022, mass capacity was raised to 240pax, following an earlier requirement that VDS (Vaccination Differentiated SMMs) be started (and PET testing be disallowed for entry into VDS Masses). Mass capacity was lifted in April to 700 VDS and 500 non-VDS Masses.

Now in October 2022, all MCCY SMM restrictions have been lifted, but the Archdiocese still has some strongly recommended practices.

Through all these tightening-loosening-tightening seasons, SFX was blessed to have a group of Safe Management Support volunteers. At every Mass, we would have between two to five volunteers to ensure SFX compliance to SMMs of both government and Archdiocese guidelines. These volunteers would setup the necessary equipment 45 to 60 minutes before Mass started, to register and count everyone coming in for Mass and a few minutes after Mass to closeup or handover to next team.

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
With each change of regulations and guidelines, volunteers needed to go through retrainings and/or briefings on what and how to handle the various changes in protocol and IT systems.

Through all this, each volunteer would have several stories to tell of how they had to turn away some people due to lack of documentation or booking; how families were separated by the seating arrangement



such that family members were seated at two separate blocks; and how some parishioners were anxious and did not behave too well towards the volunteers.

Overall, our volunteers are relieved that the worst is over. We continue to pray that Covid-19 will not have a more virulent strain requiring re-imposition of SMMs.
