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God of the Living, not the Dead

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time
6 Nov 2022

2 Mac 7:1-2, 9-14
2 Th 2:16-3:5
Lk 20:27-38

This Sunday's gospel text is rich material for eschatological reflection.

The first theme is on the resurrection. Responding to the Sadducees' challenge of the resurrection, Jesus responds by referring to Exodus 3:2-6, when Moses heard the following words from the burning bush, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." In the next line, Jesus concludes his counterargument: God is not God "of the dead, but of the living; for to him all men are in fact alive."

In other words, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob are living persons for God. Hence, just as God is not bound by the earthly law of death, so is one resurrected from the dead not bound by the Levirate law of marriage.

Ultimately, the resurrection of Christ is God's final word on the issue. However, in this narrative reported across all three Synoptic gospels, Jesus argues from a textual interpretation of the Old Testament, given that the Sadducees considered themselves experts in Scripture.

The second theme is on marriage. In his response to the Sadducees, Jesus said, "Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage; but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage." Jesus therefore draws a distinction between the life in this age and the next.

As Pope St John Paul II put it in his *Theology of the Body*, "In the future resurrection, human beings, after having reacquired their bodies... in their masculinity and femininity neither marry nor are given in marriage." Referring to the vision of marriage in Genesis in which "a man cleaves to his wife and they become one flesh" (2:24), Pope St John Paul II reflected that this "union characteristic of man right from the beginning belongs *exclusively* to this age. Marriage and procreation do not constitute, on the other hand, the eschatological future of man." To understand why, we must examine what life in the next age will be like.

The third theme, therefore, is on the nature of our resurrected bodies. Jesus said, "[Resurrected persons] do not marry because they can no longer die, for they are the same as the angels, and being children of the resurrection they are sons of God". The use of the phrase, "children of the resurrection", indicate that resurrected persons will "keep [their] human psychosomatic nature", as Pope St John Paul II said.

In the post-resurrection age, man will therefore be "same as the angels". But this similarity will not be attained by being disincarnated to become purely spiritual beings like the angels. Instead, Pope St John Paul II argues that the resurrection means that man's somatic nature will be spiritualised through a "new submission of the body to the spirit".


Because of original sin, there is a tension between our bodies and our spirit. Death entails the separation of the soul and the body, the latter of which decays. However, elaborating on the age of resurrection, Pope St John Paul II explained that eschatological man will be free from such opposition, and the resurrected body will return to "perfect unity and harmony" with the spirit. Unlike Plato's dualistic understanding that the soul will be "liberated" from the body, Catholic anthropology asserts that

eschatological perfection lies in the state of man definitely and perfectly "integrated" through a union of the soul and the body.

As Pope St John Paul II put it, "According to Christ's words reported by the synoptic Gospels, the resurrection means not only the recovery of corporeity and the re-establishment of human life in its integrity by means of the union of the body with the soul, but also a completely new state of human life itself."

Such a vision also forms the basis from which we must understand our current physical bodies – which are of the flesh, but also holy in capturing a glimpse of the perfect and resurrected bodies that we will reacquire and integrate with in the next age.

Therefore, even as we live out our earthly lives, let us treat our bodies and those of others with the dignity we deserve, inherent as children of God, and hopefully, of the resurrection as well. And as our bodies age, let us place our faith in Christ and look to the eternal life that awaits us – through him, in him, and with him – in the next age.
