Hope Cometh

2nd Sunday of Advent 4 Dec 2022

ls 11:1-10 Rom 15:4-9 Mt 3:1-12

In the second reading today, St. Paul tells us that "Everything that was written long ago in the scriptures was meant to teach us something about hope...." (Rom 15:4) The scriptures that St Paul refers to is none other than the Old Testament which is "an indispensable part of Sacred Scripture", and was "deliberately so oriented that it should prepare for and declare in prophecy the coming of Christ, redeemer of all men" (CCC 121-122). In a particular way, through Sacred Scripture consisting of the Old and New Testaments, God reveals himself to us and makes known his will by which through lesus Christ. the Word made flesh, man might come to share the divine nature in the Holy Spirit. (Dei Verbum 2)

On our part, we can come to believe in these revelations because the events of history, and in particular salvation history, and sacred scripture have an inner unity that could not have occurred by chance nor could it have been conjured up by human thought. Indeed, "the deeds wrought by God in the history of salvation manifest and confirm the teaching and realities signified by the words [of Sacred Scripture], while the words proclaim the deeds and clarify the mystery contained in them" (ibid). In other words, God told us what he was going to do, and then did what he told us he would do; all the time pointing us to the coming of Jesus, his beloved Son, who through perfect obedience to God the Father, would redeem humanity by his death and resurrection.

"Sacred Scripture have an inner unity that could not have occurred by chance nor could it have been conjured up by human thought" (cf Dei Verbum 2).

This is the hope that St Paul refers to - that God having poured out his love for us through Jesus Christ, will also give us all the graces necessary for salvation as free gifts from God. And as we exercise the virtue of hope with charity, then by the grace of God, we will act in the "obedience of faith" (Rom 1:5, 16:26) to bring about our own salvation in Christ Jesus.

Therefore, as we continue on our Advent journey, if we are to keep this hope in Jesus Christ alive in us, we must once again reinvigorate our response to the cry of John the Baptist. John's stern and uncompromising words to the Pharisees and Sadducees to repent and "produce the appropriate fruit" (Mt 3:8) should be particularly pertinent to us who often allow modern secular materialism to creep into our understanding and practice of the Christmas season. It is in the interior wilderness of our hearts that we must make straight our paths to prepare the way of the Lord. Whilst our faith in Jesus Christ is our salvation, when we come before the judgement seat of Christ at our death or at the second coming of Christ, we will be judged by what we have done in our lives (Rom 2:6-8, Rev 20:13). From the intentions

of our hearts, how we conduct our lives today and everyday decides our eternal fate.

But we are not without help. The gifts of the Holy Spirit which Isaiah says rest on Jesus (Is 11:2) have also been given to us. The gift of wisdom, insight (understanding), counsel, power, knowledge and fear of the Lord are graces that Jesus freely shares with us as members of his mystical body (which is his Church). These gifts render us docile to the promptings of the Holy Spirit in our lives, helping us to conduct our lives in union with God's will for us. The more we exercise these gifts of the Holy Spirit, the more we will act with prudence, justice, fortitude and temperance, allowing the love of God and the virtue of charity to be the well-spring of all our actions.

So we, who have been baptised with the Holy Spirit and fire (Mt 3:11) must once again heed the words of John the Baptist. During this Advent, let us reconcile ourselves to God through the Sacrament of Repentance; and bear fruit that befits the hope that is in us, knowing that "even now the axe is laid to the roots of the trees, so that any tree which fails to produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown on the fire" (Mt 3:10).

St. Francis Xavier: A Life of Zeal & Miracles

December 3, 2022 marks the 470th year since the death of our patron, St Francis Xavier, in 1552 and the 400th year of his canonisation in 1622.



As part of the Feast Day Celebrations, there will be a photo exhibit of St. Francis Xavier's conversion and his zealous missionary work in India, South-east Asia and Japan.

- A 70-year-old Third Class Relic from the 1952 Exposition of his incorrupt body in Goa.
- A print of a letter written from Singapore dated 1552 in Francis' own handwriting.
- A taxidermied Crucifix Crab with the (miraculous!) cross on its carapace.



There were 5 priests (Fr. Ben, Fr. Nathaniel, Fr. John Sim, Fr. Abel Antony and Fr. David Garcia) who administered the Sacrament of Reconciliation to about 100 participants.

After the Mass, there was a gathering held at JP II hall where participants were welcomed with refreshments, light snacks and community singing led by an inspired group of singers and musicians from Holy Trinity and other parishes. What a way to end the day on a high note after being healed by Our Saviour!
