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# *Theotokos:*Bearer of God

Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God 1 January 2023

Num 6:22-27 Gal 4:4-7 Lk 2:16-21

This Sunday, we celebrate the divine maternity of Mary. For Christians today, that Jesus is God is central to our faith, and it therefore follows that Mary is the Mother of God. But these were controversial issues – both theologically and politically – in early Christendom.

Around 400AD, the nature of Christ was still hotly debated. A faction of Christians, known as Arians, believed that Jesus was a 'created' being and his divinity was therefore 'lesser' than his Father, who alone was infinite, almighty, and eternal. The First Council of Nicaea in 325AD quashed this heresy by adopting the Nicene Creed, which held in its original formulation that Jesus was "the Son of God... begotten not made, of one substance with the Father". However, Arianism continued to hold sway among a significant segment of early Christians.

Enter in Nestorius, a priest from Antiochwho became the Archbishop of Constantinople (428 to 431AD). A firm opponent of Arianism, Nestorius nonetheless attempted to find a middle ground. In doing so, he promulgated a heresy of his own – that while Christ was truly God, he was born of Mary (only) as a man, rather than the divine Word (i.e. Logos) who existed before Mary herself. Nestorius accordingly argued that Mary was merely the *Christotokos* (Christ-bearer), not the

Amidst competition between Alexandria and Constantinople - two out of five sees of the Pentarchy in early Christendom this theological dispute became Nestorius' politicised. fiercest opponent was the Patriarch Cyril of Alexandria, who accused Nestorius of severing Christ's divinity from his humanity, thereby denying the reality and integrity of the Incarnation. Following Cyril's appeal to Pope Celestine, Nestorius was instructed to recant his teachings on pain of excommunication.

However, Nestorius went on a counter-offensive, convincing Emperor Theodosius II to convene a general church council at Ephesus before the Pope's ultimatum could take effect.

This was imprudent on two counts. First, Ephesusitselfwas a special seat for the veneration of Mary, where the *Theotokos* formulation was popular. As Nestorius himself later noted, Cyril's followers managed to "[rouse] up a disturbance and discord among the people with an outcry, as though the emperor were opposed to God".

Second, Nestorius acted against the advice of even his supporters and fellow Antiochene tradition representatives, such as the Patriarch John of Antioch, who had urged him to submit to the Pope's judgment. While John



had maintained his support for Nestorius in the Council of Ephesus of 431AD, he eventually reconciled with Cyril in 433AD.

In The Formula of Reunion, a letter that Cyril wrote to John to forge ecclesiastical unity, both Patriarchs thus confessed that Jesus Christ was "the only begotten Son of God, perfect God and perfect man... begotten before all ages from the Father according to his divinity... born of Mary the Virgin, according to his humanity, consubstantial with his Father according to his divinity and consubstantial with us according to his humanity, for there became a union of two natures. ... According to this understanding of this unmixed union, we confess the holy Virgin to be Mother of God..."

In 451AD, the Council of Chalcedon affirmed the Council of Ephesus' declaration that Mary held the title of 'Mother of God'. This was again reiterated by Pope Pius XI in 1931 as a dogma of the Catholic Church through his encyclical *Lux Veritatis*.

As we continue to celebrate the miracle of the Incarnation during Christmastide – the birth of Christ, who is the Word made flesh and God made man – let us also remember that Mary is his mother and offer her the reverence and honour due to her. And let us emulate her, as this Sunday's Gospel text records, by "treasur[ing] these things and ponder[ing] them" in our hearts.
