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The Church -Christ's Salt and Light

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time 5 Feb 2023

Is 58:7-10 1 Cor 2:1-5 Mt 5:13-16


Salt and light have been getting bad press recently. Health warnings of salt causing cardiovascular disease and light stimulation from devices leading to sleep deprivation are increasingly making the news, reminding us to be watchful over salt intake and light exposure.

With these current perceptions of salt and light, Jesus' call in today's gospel to be his "salt of the earth [and] light of the world" (Mt 5:13,14) needs some contextualising.

For Jesus' predominantly Jewish audience, the imageries of "salt" and "light" would have immediately turned their minds to God. Specifically, it would have made them think of "covenant" and "creation".

Salt had a strong covenant symbolism. Every grain and meat offering in the Temple had to be seasoned with salt despite it being a very expensive commodity at that time (cf Lev 2:13, Ez 43:18-25). This was to teach the Israelites to trust in God and be ready to forego earthly riches. God had also made two "covenant[s] of salt" or perpetual and lasting covenants with the priests and with King David (Num 18:19, 2 Chr 13:5). By these covenants, God promised to provide for his priests through the temple offerings so that they would be a sign of his providential care. To King David, God promised that the King's throne would forever be occupied by one of the King's descendants.

As for the call to be his "light of the world", Jesus' listeners would have instantly recalled God's first words and act at the beginning of creation, "Let there be light" (Gen 1:3). Creation and covenant were closely connected. In sending his light into the "darkness" (Gen 1:1) of the world, God's radiance and glory which gives life and joy had also penetrated the void. Israel's "creation" was a calling out of the darkness of Ur into the promised land with its "foundations" in the light of the laws and wisdom of God (cf Gen 12:1, Hebr 11:8-10).



Being in covenant with God thus meant that the Jewish people now shared in God's love, life and wisdom. This blessedness should have been manifested in unstinting "good works" such that others, "seeing

[these] good works... may give praise to [their] Father in heaven" (Mt 5:16). It was with disappointment, therefore, that Isaiah had to remind the Israelites, "share your bread with the hungry...shelter the homeless poor, clothe [the] naked...turn not from your own kin" (Is 58:7).

Despite the ancient Israelites' unfaithfulness in living justly according to their blessings, God still kept his "covenant of salt" made with King David. Matthew relates that Christ was not only "son of David" (Mt 1:1) but also the Son of God (cf Mt 3:17). Through Christ, God made a new and definitive covenant by establishing a "kingdom of heaven on earth" (CCC 541). The Catechism explains that the Church is this kingdom by which God the Father "raise[s] up men to share in his own divine life". God does this by "gathering men around his Son Jesus Christ. This gathering is the Church, 'on earth the seed and beginning of that kingdom'" (ibid.) where everything is shared, "there [are] no needy persons" (Acts 4:34). Christians must be characterised by an unstinting generosity to give to anyone in need because we already have everything in our communion with "the crucified Christ" (1 Cor 2:2) who died so that we may receive "the power of the Spirit" (1 Cor 2:4) which gives us eternal life.

In Salt of the Earth: The Church at the End of the Millennium, then Cardinal Ratzinger (Pope Benedict XVI), called on the Church to be rooted in Christ and avoid being "a self-governing body that offers certain services". The Church must live "in vital circles of really convinced believers [for] in this way [she] will... become the salt of the earth again... She must be aware of her quite specific mission: to be the world's escape from itself into the light of God ... so that the air we breathe can penetrate into the world."

May we be that generous and faith-filled "salt" and "light" for Christ today.




heroic life of forgiveness and mercy which led her to become a saint.

You are the Salt and Light!


Jesus says we are the salt of the earth. Have you ever tasted food that wasn't salty enough? It can taste pretty bland. But do you notice when food has the right amount of salt? Usually we don't think about it. It's kind of hiding in the

food and making it taste good. Jesus wants us to be like the "salt" in the world, with the goodness and truth that He gives us.

Jesus also says that we are the light of the world. Can you imagine a completely dark world: no sun or lights or anything? It would be pretty scary. You'd never know what was happening or where you were going. That's what the world can be like for people who don't have the light of God's truth. It's our job to bring the truth to the world so that everyone can see that God loves them.

Contact the Parish Office 12 months before your intended date to book the church premises and ensure that your presiding priest is able to make that date.
