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# Called To Live Above Ourselves

7<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time 19 Feb 2023

Lev 19:1-2, 17-18 1 Cor 3:16-23 Mt 5:38-48

Today's readings are an invitation to us to ponder over some of Jesus' most ardent and yet demanding of commandments. The First Reading from the Book of Leviticus gives us three basic principles of morality and of life. The first is that we must be holy; second, that we must be holy because God is holy; and third, that this holiness means loving our neighbour as ourselves.

It is simply not enough that we live our lives in a way that is just acceptable or good in our own eyes or in the eyes of others. Instead, our meaning and purpose is to be holy in God's eyes. God's demand is not to fulfill the expectations of the world or of ourselves but of God, who is the Alpha and the Omega. We are not the standard; God is!

What follows thereafter is the command to "love [our] neighbour as ourselves", but it is not the kind of love we understand of as a human feeling but love as a choice of the will - to will the good of our neighbour. While it can seem impossible to love (as a feeling) the ones who hurt and insult us because this kind of love cannot be commanded on demand, we can consciously choose to wish well for them. Therefore, the love for our enemies is not essentially a feeling, it is a choice.

Today's Gospel continues Jesus' theme of establishing a new order by raising the bar for Christians. The Old Mosaic Law which pronounced

"An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth" defined justice, but it also limited the recompense to what was just and equal. It allowed for the victim to expect and exact a punishment commensurate to the harm done to them but not an excessive one.

Jesus' call to "turn the other cheek", may be an invitation to sacrifice the full recompense even when we may have a legitimate right. However, such sacrifice does not mean that we refrain from expecting justice. On the contrary, Christian love - the special way of mercy and generosity - is far superior to justice. Pope Francis says there is a clear distinction that Jesus wants us to make between justice and revenge. We should ask for and exercise justice but we are not permitted to avenge ourselves or, in any way exact revenge, as it is an expression of hatred and violence. He says that revenge is never just and will never lead to conflict resolution. The command is to avoid repaying others the evil they have done to us and more importantly to seek to generously do good to them (Angelus, 19 Feb, 2017).

Let us remember that our enemies are human beings too, created also in God's image, "*Imago Dei*", despite the fact that in the present, that image may be tarnished by deplorable behaviour. When we speak of "enemies", we should not think about people as too different from ourselves. Instead, we should also talk about ourselves, as we too may come into conflict with our neighbour, our colleagues and even within our families!

Jesus' call is to not just love in principle, but to put it in practice through our actions that expands the kind of loving relationship that God commanded. God wants his way of love and mercy to be our way too. It is a radical call to do the opposite of what others would expect of us.

Created in the image of God, we need to become more aware that our choice of actions and responses when we are wronged can reflect God's belief in us. God is reminding us to "be holy, for I am holy" and we should remember his mercy poured out for us, for God punishes far less than we deserve and forgives far more than we deserve (cf Ps 102:10).

Perhaps if we, like Paul, remember who we are and share in this new identity with Christ that "it is no longer I who live, but Christ [who] lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God who loved me and gave Himself for me" (Gal 2:20), then Jesus' call to us is possible because God is with us.



#### The Art of Lent - A painting a day from Ash Wednesday to Easter by Sister Wendy Beckett


