## Heeding Jesus' farewell message

6<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter 14 May 2023

Ac 8:5-8, 14-17 1 Pt 3:15-18 Jn 14:15-21

This week's Gospel reading is part of what is commonly referred to as Jesus' farewell message to the Apostles. He has completed his public ministry and is about to be arrested, mocked, abused and tortured to death on the cross. Knowing all this, what does our Lord say to his closest friends who are destined to continue his mission? This is such an important moment in the formation and understanding of our faith, we should hang on to his every word as he prepares them for the battle to save the soul of the world. Our Lord's final discourse is contained in John 13-16, of which today's reading (Jn 14:15-21) is part of. What was his all important parting message?

First, Jesus spoke about his identity: He is the only way to the truth and to a life with God.

Next, his reassurance to them about what will come next, telling them that even though he will not be with them, another Advocate will be sent by God to guide them. Indeed our Lord says that his absence will be to the disciples' benefit, as the Holy Spirit will then be sent to help them in their mission. "Still, I must tell you the truth; it is for your own good that I am going because unless I go, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. And when he comes, he will show the world how wrong it was, about sin and about who was in the right..."

(Jn 16:7-8). Jesus is preparing them for his departure, assuring them that it is a necessary part of God's plan which is ultimately to unite them with the Father through his love for them.

In the Gospel reading today, Jesus repeats this reassurance. "I will not leave you orphans; I will come back to you. In a short time the world will no longer see me; but you will see me, because I live and you will live. On that day you will understand that I am in my Father and you in me and I in you" (Jn 14:18-19).

These words were directed at his Apostles, but they are as relevant to us. He is telling us that even though he is no longer physically with us, he lives in our heart and is in us, as we are in him. The question we have to ask ourselves is whether we see and feel him.

How can we see Jesus? Our Lord provides the answer in the reading. "Anybody who receives my commandments and keeps them will be one who loves me; and anybody who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I shall love him and show myself to him" (Jn 14:21). He is telling us not to worry about whether we can see him: He will show himself to us! But only if we keep his commandments which he

says we will surely do if we love him.

Love is our Lord's core message in this farewell address.

As Pope Francis put it in a homily last year, "He loved us first; he waits for us; he keeps loving us. This is our identity: We are God's loved ones. This is our strength: We are loved by God" (Pope Francis, 22 May 2022).

Jesus' farewell message to the Apostles is as pointed today as it was more than 2,000 years ago. Indeed the present world is like that of the early Christians in terms of the challenges faced by the faithful. Large parts of the modern world have rejected Christianity, in pursuit of worldly distractions that draw people further away from God. It is a world which Jesus said in the reading, "can never receive since it neither sees nor knows him" (In 14:17). As Christians, we are privileged to belong to the other part of the world that is able to see.

In return, all that Jesus asked is for us to love one another as he loved us.

The power of such a love to transform our lives and those around us is a gift from God.

Let us use it to fulfil Jesus' last wish.

### For the Love of Mary by Fr. Daniel Maria Klimek

For the Love of Mary takes the reader on a spiritual journey of tender love that begins with the questions, "How do I fall in love with Mary, the mother of Jesus and my spiritual mother? How do I cultivate a deeper, more intimate and meaningful relationship with her, inviting her into my spiritual life?". The author presents a path of deep spiritual intimacy with Mother Mary that includes practicing the "presence of Mary" in one's life, among many other beautiful devotions.

### The Reed of God by Caryll Houselander


### Mary, Mother of All by Dr. Scott Hahn & Emily Stimpson Chapman
