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Jesus the Redeemer

12th Sunday of Ordinary Time 25 June 2023

Jer 20:10-13 Rom 5:12-15 Mt 10:26-33

This Sunday's gospel reading is part of a larger narrative in which lesus gives his disciples their mission in three sections, each ending with "for truly I tell you".

In the first section (Mt 10:5-15), Jesus gives directions for the brief and temporary mission that his disciples would immediately go forth to carry out. The second section (Mt 10:16-23) opens out into the permanent exercise of the Gospel ministry. And the third (Mt 10:24-42) expands to the service of Christ in the widest sense for the whole Church.

In carrying out our mission for Christ, this Sunday's readings call us to stand firm in our faith and assure us that the Lord will redeem us at the end.

First, Jesus tells his disciples not to be afraid of those who "kill the body but cannot kill the soul; fear him rather who can destroy both body and soul in hell" (Mt 10:28). This reframes our objectives as we carry out the mission – to strive not for gains in this life, but in the next; to fear not what can be lost in this life, but in the next.

In this regard, Jesus assures us that if we declare ourselves for him "in the presence of men", he will declare himself for us "in the presence of [his] Father in heaven". (Mt 10:32) We thus look not for glory and riches in this world, but in the next.

Similarly, the prophet Jeremiah bemoans how he has been those disparaged and how

who used to be his friends now "watched for [his] downfall". But amidst such worldly suffering, he is secure in his knowledge that "the Lord is at my side, a mighty hero... for he has delivered the soul of the needy from the hands of evil men". (Jer 20:13)

The second point is on how Jesus redeems us. St Paul sets out his fullest explanation in his letter to the Romans, in which he argues essentially that Jesus is the second Adam.

In Rom 5:12, Paul points out how Adam's first sin brought death to all men: "Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned."

But Paul then notes that "divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift".

Through Adam's sin, man in his pride turns away from God. Through Jesus' death and resurrection, man in his obedience is reconciled with God.

And if Adam, who was only human, brought death; how much more would grace, brought by Jesus, who was both human and divine, bring salvation. Hence, Paul argues, "Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall." (Rom 5:15)

Just as Adam's sin applies to all men as it was the Original Sin, so does Jesus' redemption apply to all men as he is the Redeemer.

We are therefore redeemed insofar as we unite ourselves with Christ.

In our modern lives today in Singapore, we do not often encounter physical persecution and martyrdom. But we can be 'killed' in other ways for our faith - mocked for being 'unrealistic', laughed at for being 'naïve', criticised for 'blind obedience'.

During these times, let us remember that, like Jeremiah, the Lord is a mighty hero at our side. Let us recall Jesus' exhortation not to be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Above all, let us set our sights on the prize of eternal life, and not of the things of this world.

When a love offering is requested for church activities, during Mass or when getting food from our church canteen, do we give a nominal amount or do we give generously what we can afford, a voluntary and heartfelt expression of love for our church and community?

The key points below are adopted from a speech given by Archbishop William Goh at a Catholic Foundation Dinner on 18 October 2017 where he discussed the five spiritual reasons why the act of giving is an important aspect of the faith.

1. When we give, we are acknowledging that God is the creator of all things and the giver of all things

Our success is achieved not only through our own efforts but more importantly, God's divine providence. He has sent the right people and opportunities to us. Therefore, if we have the ability to give, it is only because God is the source of all blessings. Without Him, we would be nowhere. Giving can be "overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God." (2 Cor 9:12)



3. Having the capacity to give is to share in the heart of God

St Paul said that God blesses us with resources so that we can share in His blessings. What are the blessings in life that we are called to share? When we give our time or resources, we receive fulfilment, meaning and a joy that cannot be described.





2. We are all trustees of the resources and talents He has given us

God does not give us things only for our own use. We are accountable to Him and to our fellow men for how we use what God has blessed us with.




4. God will bless you when you bless others

"Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously." (2 Cor 9:6)

5. Every baptised Catholic and Christian is called to share in the mission of the Church
