A Concise Guide to Living a Christian Life

14th Sunday of Ordinary Time 9 Jul 2023

Zec 9:9-10 Rom 8:9, 11-13 Mt 11:25-30

There is something wonderful about Mass readings in the way they capture the essence of our faith so succinctly and yet so profoundly. As they are our Lord's words, we expect nothing less. Still, it is remarkable how much can be read into these short excerpts of the Holy Book every week. Today's readings illustrate this so well that you might call it the Concise Guide to Living a Christian Life.

Let's unpack the essential points.

The opening line of the Gospel reading has Jesus in a thanksgiving prayer to his Father, proclaiming him as Lord of heaven and earth.

It is the starting point of our faith, that God is creator of both the physical and the spiritual world.

This idea of the Almighty as supreme leader over everything is, at once, too overwhelming to comprehend.

God understands the limits of our understanding, and the reading goes on to place it in human terms.

"I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." he continues. There is further elaboration in the first reading from Zechariah with the image of a king riding a donkey pledging to end warfare.

Our Lord is one of love and peace.



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It is well and good to be told this, but how do we get close to him and what must we do?

"Come to me, all you who labour and are overburdened, and I will give you rest. Shoulder my yoke and learn from me... Yes my yoke is easy, and my burden light" (Mt 11:28-30).

On the face of it, it appears that Jesus is only calling on those who feel oppressed and are suffering from whatever afflicts them.

But it isn't the case. His point really is that those in pain, both physically and spiritually, are the ones most likely to turn to God because they need him most. They might have exhausted all other worldly means and their hearts are more open to his words.

On the other hand, those living in comfort in their own world are more likely to believe they can take care of themselves and have no need for divine intervention.

Our Lord's message is that this sense of self and false belief in our own personal ability is what prevents us from hearing his call.

But he knows we are too used to our ways, and change is always difficult, even for those who struggle to find meaning in life.

Hence, our Lord's assurance that when you come to him, his 'yoke is easy and my burden light'.

He is not saying that leading a Christian life is effortless. He knows it is not and the journey is full of pitfalls.

That is why his instruction to us is clear and direct: Come to me. Take my yoke. Learn from me.

This is not a doctrine or a set of ethical rules but a discipleship in which we submit to Christ.

Jesus is telling us to go to him personally and make him the centre of our life.

As Pope Francis stated in a homily at the Holy See in 2016, when Jesus places his yoke on his disciples, "he is at the centre of their relationship with God... and sets himself as the fulcrum of each one's life. Thus receiving 'Jesus' yoke', each disciple enters into communion with him and participates in the mystery of the Cross and in his destiny of salvation" (Pope Francis, 14 Sep 2016).

It requires a childlike attitude to do so, not in the sense of being ignorant and gullible but in being free from our self-centred prejudices.

The second reading from Romans reinforces this point when St Paul calls on us to stop living 'unspiritual lives'.

"If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body you will live" (Rom 8:13).

The promise of eternal life completes this weekly guide, but only if 'the Spirit of God dwells in you' (Rom 8:9).

Altar Servers Investiture 2023

The investiture ceremony took place on Sat 1 July during the evening Mass, where a total of seven dedicated individuals were vested with the responsibility of serving at the altar. During the ceremony, Brother Bartolo delivered a heartfelt speech, reminding the new altar servers that being an altar server is not just a co-curricular activity, but a role that requires many sacrifices. He emphasised the importance of remembering who they serve at the altar - none other than Christ himself. To truly imitate Christ, Brother Bartolo encouraged the altar servers to have a spirit of prayer and to let that spirit guide them in their daily lives. He expressed that this spirit of prayer will bear fruit and that wherever they go, they will radiate Christ to others. Mass Etiquette: 10 things to do (or not do) in Mass



Fast before Mass

Fast for at least an hour before receiving Holy Communion, with the exception of water and medicine. The purpose of fasting is to help us prepare to receive Jesus in the Eucharist.

Cross yourself with Holy Water

Do so upon entering and leaving the church. This is a reminder of our Baptism, which made us members of Christ's Church.

Dress modestly and appropriately

Wear your Sunday best. As Catholics, we believe that God comes down to meet us at every Mass. So, why would we not dress up?



If for some reason you cannot be on time, then try to sit in the back so you do not disturb or distract others. Getting to Mass early allows you to pray and prepare yourself better for Mass.



Christ is present in the Tabernacle. By allowing our right knee to hit the floor, we acknowledge that he is our Lord and God. If someone is physically unable to genuflect, then a bow is sufficient. During Mass, if you pass in front of the altar or tabernacle, do bow reverently.

Observe sacred silence while in Church

Once you enter Church - it is not the time or place to chat with those around you. If you must talk, do so as quietly and briefly as possible. Remember that your conversation might be disturbing someone who is in prayer.

Prepare your offering before Mass

Keeping the basket while you get your wallet out can sometimes become quite a scene. Preparing your offering before Mass will help minimise distractions.

Bow before receiving Holy Communion

God is present in the Eucharist and we need to show our respect and reverence with a bow of the head.

Do not leave early

Stay to the end of the recession and the hymn that accompanies it, if there is one.

Pray after Mass

It is good to offer a prayer of thanksgiving after Mass is over.
