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Jesus, truly the Son of God

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time 13 Aug 2023

1 Kgs 19:9, 11-13 Rom 9:1-5 Mt 14:22-33

In today's gospel, Jesus makes known his identity as Son of God to the apostles by walking on water. "Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid", Jesus says to quell the fearful disciples when they think he may be a ghost. Though this takes place shortly after Jesus had performed the miracle of feeding the five thousand, the apostles still fail to recognise Jesus for who he truly is, instead they deem him a ghost and are terrified. Bible scholars refer to this biblical account as a theophany, an appearance where God makes himself known, demonstrating his power and might. Jesus reveals this by comforting the disciples and using the phrase, "It is I." This phrase was used in other Old Testament theophanies and is translated literally from Greek as "I am", the divine name of God. It has been used by God in instances such as his response to Moses through the burning bush, when Moses asks God for his name (cf Ex 3:13-14).

It is through his use of "It is I" and his demonstration of sovereignty over the elements, that Jesus allows the disciples a glimpse of his divinity. He comes to them while their boat is battling the wind and waves, moments where they were uncertain and afraid. Jesus' revelation is also for us, in our own moments of anguish. Jesus reminds us that he is truly the Son

of God and is thus in control. As we face the anxieties of our lives, it is only natural to get swept up in them, just as the disciples were in the boat. However, Jesus comforts us, showing that when we call out to him in prayer as Peter did when he was sinking into the water, Jesus will reach out to save us.

This gospel account is also an invitation for us to ponder whether we are able to step out onto the water in trust like Peter, to wherever Jesus may be calling us. Peter had the faith to leave the boat toward Jesus, but began to falter as soon as he took his eyes off Jesus, getting distracted by the winds. Similarly, it is when our gaze strays from Jesus and his Lordship that fear and anxiety threaten to overwhelm us. How do we remain steadfast in our walk with the Lord?

Elijah's example in the first reading enlightens us. Elijah, though disheartened in his flight to Mount

Sinai from the wicked Queen Jezebel, was visited by the Lord. During the visit, Elijah was able to discern that the Lord came to him in the intimate, still small voice, and not in the mighty wind, earthquake and fire that had come earlier. Through his intimacy in relationship with God, he was able to hear God's voice. Conversely, the disciples who spent much time living and serving alongside Jesus did not realise it was him walking toward them on the water. Similarly, we who have encountered the Lord and learnt more about him may still find it challenging to listen to him and discern his voice if we do not cultivate an intimate relationship of prayer. Jesus himself, prioritised stepping away from the crowds and his disciples to spend time alone with his father. He exemplifies how we may also grow in that same intimacy with the Lord through quiet time spent in prayer, away from the world.

This prayerful and intimate relationship with Jesus fortifies us during the storms of our lives. Conversing deeply with the Lord allows us to know and recognise his voice that speaks through our lives and in our hearts. As we come to a more profound relationship with the Lord, we are more able to claim his promises and surrender our fears to him. We too, may then be able to step out of our boats and walk toward Jesus, professing his sovereignty over our lives. As we grow in understanding of Jesus' identity as Son of God, may we bow down in true worship of the God who saves us and loves us beyond measure.


