









The Rock of the Church

21st Sunday in Ordinary Time 27 Aug 2023

lsa 22:19-23 Rom 11:33-36 Mt 16:13-20

In this Sunday's gospel text, Jesus declares to Simon Peter: "You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church."

What made Peter so special?

Because Peter recognized who Jesus was. Peter confesses that Jesus is "the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Mt 16:16).

This was a radical notion at that time. As our gospel text notes, people said that the Son of Man (an exalted figure prophesied in Daniel 7 as Israel's liberator) was John the Baptist, Elijah, Jeremiah, or one of the prophets. Pope Benedict XVI wrote in Jesus of Nazareth: From the Baptism in the Jordan to the Transfiguration that Elijah personifies hope for the restoration of Israel while Jeremiah is the bearer of the promise of a New Covenant (cf Chapter Nine, Two Milestones on Jesus' Way: Peter's Confession and the Transfiguration p292).

While these figures point towards the mystery of who Jesus is, "they do not arrive at Jesus' identity, at his newness. They interpret him in terms of the past, in terms of the predictable and the possible, not in terms of himself, his uniqueness, which cannot be assigned to any other category," as Pope Benedict XVI wrote.



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"Because of the faith he confessed Peter will remain the unshakable rock of the Church. His mission will be to keep this faith from every lapse and to strengthen his brothers in it." - Catechism of the Catholic Church 552

But not only is Peter's confession wholly new, it was also scandalous to Jewish society. At Jesus' trial before the Sanhedrin, the high priest reprises Peter's confession, but this time as an accusation. In acknowledging the title, Jesus puts himself on an equal footing with God himself. In Jewish law, this is blasphemy, and the high priest therefore rends his robe. Jesus was convicted and crucified, not for what he did, but for who he was – an identity that was revealed to Peter (cf Mt 26:64ff).

What, then, does this mean for Peter?

Commissioned as the "rock" upon which Jesus will build his Church, Peter is conferred primacy among the disciples. CCC552 accordingly states that Peter holds "the first place in the college of the Twelve... Because of the faith he confessed, Peter will remain the unshakeable rock of the Church. His mission will be to keep this faith from every lapse and to strengthen his brothers in it."

The First Reading from Isaiah prefigures this commissioning. Just as Eliakim was given the key of the House of David, so was Peter given the keys of the kingdom of heaven. As Eliakim was entrusted with the authority to open and to close, Peter was entrusted with the power to bind and to loose (cf Isa 22:22 & Mt 16:19).

This does not merely mean that Peter is a doorkeeper to heaven. The kingdom of heaven refers to God's sovereignty, which Jesus also establishes on earth (albeit not of worldly authority) through and in himself.

Despite Peter's flaws, he was the first among the disciples to recognize and articulate who Jesus truly was – when Jesus first called him to put his net out into the deep, when he reached out to Jesus as he was sinking on the stormy lake, and finally, when he confessed the identity of Jesus in this Sunday's gospel text (cf Lk 5:8, Mt 14:33, Mt 16:19).

In the end, the task of the disciple is to truly know the Lord.

This knowing the Lord or "encountering the Lord in a personal way" was also highlighted by His Eminence William Cardinal Goh in his vision of his Cardinalate which he spelt out in Ut Vivant: The Next Lap published at the Thanksgiving Mass for his elevation to the College of Cardinals on 27 August 2022. On this anniversary of his Cardinalate, let us pray that His Eminence William Cardinal Goh will continue to know the Lord more fully even as he is entrusted with more responsibilities and authority. May the Holy Spirit continue to guide him to do the Lord's will as he supports the Petrine ministry, and may he remain the unshakeable rock of the Singapore Catholic Church.

Each Sunday, we celebrate the order of the Mass (Liturgy of the Word) and break the Word in an age appropriate manner with the children, so that they understand and be enriched in their awareness of God's love, the humanity of Jesus and the seasons of the Church. The Liturgy of the Word with Children centres on Jesus and his message. It is a special time for the children to hear Jesus speak to them.

We are on duty every Sunday during the 11am Mass (except during school holidays) and preparation meetings occur once a month. We also plan and conduct children-specific events for key feast days/occasions (Advent, Christmas, Children's Day).

Small Christian Communities

We gather to break the Word of God together so as to support each other in our struggles to be faithful to the gospel and to encourage one another to serve the needs of others. We meet regularly, at least once a month, in our homes/zoom to break the Word. We also attend relevant talks, parish-wide events, and events involving the other SCCs.

Wardens

The wardens have been serving the parish since the church was built in 1959. Wardens have the role of keeping good order, peace, and tranquillity for worship in Church. The duties and responsibilities of Wardens include ushering parishioners to seats during Mass, collection of offertory from parishioners during Mass. Manage and direct movement of parishioners during Processions and Holy Communion during Mass. Manage and direct movement as well as parking of vehicles in church. Wardens also help with cutting and cleaning palm branches for Palm Sunday. Every Warden strives to serve with love and undertakes to serve and not to be served.
