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The Cross – Carry it or Drop it

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time 3 Sep 2023

Jer 20:7-9 Rom 12:1-2 Mt 16:21-27

From rock to stumbling block. First, Peter professes his faith in Jesus' divine sonship - the next moment he opposes the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus.

By opposing the idea of Jesus' suffering and dying, Peter opposes the way that God has chosen to redeem the world. Hence the rebuke by Jesus: "Get behind me, Satan!" (Mt 26:23)

True discipleship entails suffering. Jesus calls his disciples to take up their cross and follow him (cf Mt 16:24). Jesus is not simply asking us to embrace the pains and sufferings of our lives aimlessly, and call them "crosses". The deeper meaning of the call to "take up our cross" is to imitate Christ - to love like him and be obedient to his Father's will.

Carrying our crosses perfunctorily and suffering purposelessly make us sad and miserable. Like the pharisees' scrupulous observance of the law, it becomes obligatory and burdensome. In union with Christ, it becomes easy and light (cf Mt 11:30). The cross is a paradox of joy and peace amidst pain and suffering - there, the love of God smothers the effects of sin.

In the 1st Reading, prophet Jeremiah experiences this paradox (cf Jer 20:9). He laments because he has a tough time warning the citizens

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of Jerusalem of the impending destruction of their city and their exile in Babylon unless they repent. The people of Jerusalem do not like the message, imprisons and tries to kill him.

Jeremiah feels duped by God. He does his job as a prophet but gains nothing but persecution. He tries to evade his duty but overcomes his fears and dread with a willing and joyful compulsion through God's grace.

Many of us may have a similar love-hate relationship with God. What can tempt us away from our crosses?

We need to be wary of our feelings. The world today tells us that if we feel it, it must be true. So, if we get tired of our spouse, get a divorce. If we do not want a baby, get an abortion. If we are uncomfortable being a boy, try being a girl.

In the 2nd Reading, Paul advises the Romans not to model themselves on the behaviour of the world. This applies to us too.

When our feelings and desires, exacerbated by societal norms, are in conflict with what we know to be true, a "new mind" is needed to bring our will and our lower nature into concert with the truth.

Paul says renewing our minds is the only way to discover the will of God and know what is good (cf Rom 12:2). The motivation to follow Christ should come from an inner compulsion, not an external compulsion of the Law. We should aspire to become a "living sacrifice", Paul's equivalent of the cross. When we transform our minds and order our will to the truth, our feelings will eventually follow and be formed in truth too.

Suffering is against human nature. Carrying our crosses requires God's grace. We cannot do it on our own effort.

If we are not reconciled to God and not living in a state of grace, we have fundamentally said no to God and his plan for our lives and yes to the devil. We will not be able to distinguish the difference between the inspirations of God and the temptations of the devil.

Living a life of grace means that we are living without unconfessed mortal sins and following the teachings of the Church (cf CCC 1495-1497, 857). We should receive the Sacrament of Penance and the Eucharist at least once a year – but monthly confession and daily Eucharist are strongly recommended (cf CCC 1457-1458, 1389). Cultivation of prayer life is essential to grow in intimacy with God.

Crosses are a blessing to the one who carries it, and a curse to the one who drops it. When carried, we become instruments of God's plan. When dropped, we become instruments of the devil. It is not enough to know and believe. We have to live it to become true disciples.

A Mighty River

"Let Justice and Peace Flow" is the theme chosen for Season of Creation 2023, the ecumenical celebration we hold each year from Sep 1, World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, to 4 Oct, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi.

The prophet Amos cries out, "But let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream!" (Amos 5: 24), and so we are called to join the river of justice and peace, to embrace climate and ecological justice, and to speak out with and for communities that are most impacted by climate injustice and biodiversity loss.

Pope Francis' second encyclical, Laudato si', continues his call for the care and protection of our common home, the Earth. Building upon his first encyclical released in 2015, this document addresses the urgent need for ecological conversion and action in the face

of environmental degradation, climate change, and social injustice.

In Laudato si', Pope Francis highlights the interconnectedness of all aspects of life on Earth, asserting that our disregard for nature not only harms the environment but also affects vulnerable communities and future generations. He emphasizes the need for a holistic approach that integrates the environment, economy, and society, while advocating for the role of science, technology, and education in finding sustainable solutions.
