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## Love Makes Us Diligent Stewards

33<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time  
19 Nov 2023

**Prov 31: 10-13; 19-20; 30-31**  
**1 Th 5: 1-6**  
**Mt 25: 14-30**

A talent is an innate gift, or a propensity for some good that God lends to every person, though not in the same form or extent. Lend, because we are merely stewards, not owners, as everything we have belongs to him.

In today's Gospel, the first and second servants doubled the talents their master gave them. One had five and the other only two, but they both made fruitful use of the talents and received the same reward – a place in the kingdom of God, where they are told to “come and join in your master's happiness” (Mt 25: 21).

This tells us something important about the essential aspects of Heaven – which is being joyful for all eternity. Joyful eternity is what is at stake for us too.

Knowing this, dare we still live like the third servant, who conveniently hid his one talent and did nothing with it? He who was cast “into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth”? (Mt 25: 30)

What does it mean to multiply our talents? True or false modesty may have many of us say, “But, we have no talents!”

Abilities and wealth are not the only definitions of talents. They include our duties of state as spouses, parents, children, friends, teachers, students, preachers, healers, administrators, as well

as everything else that God has enabled us to do in life, whether as musicians, writers, business people, or philanthropists; talents also include the time on our hands, and our sufferings.

We are all called to different vocations that may not seem spectacular, but are nevertheless life-giving and necessary to the salvation and care of others. Are we diligently, faithfully carrying them out, fulfilling them day in and day out, like the valiant, virtuous, hardworking wife in Proverbs 31? The most seemingly ordinary and mundane gift from God can be extraordinary, far-reaching, and transformative, when we have the wisdom to attentively cultivate it and use it for the good of others.

It is tempting to do nothing with our charism and be lax in our vocation. It is easier not to make the effort to extend ourselves, to mind our own beeswax. Doing so is to commit the grave sin of omission (CCC 1853). This has consequences. If we do not “invest” our gifts from God, we commit spiritual sloth. Sadly, this is pervasive in our culture – failing to act when we should; failing to utilise the spiritual and physical gifts that God has given us.

Alas, stewardship *is* hard; it is a daily grind till our last breath. It is exhausting and difficult, it takes discipline and steadfastness; sometimes it is thankless and dangerous. In adversity, stewardship is near impossible.

God does not give the same talents to everyone, or even the same amount of it – but we are all anointed in one way or another, with gifts that are life-giving. Are we nurturing them to nurture others? Are we living with great love?

Indeed, what makes stewardship effective and rewarding is love. Only love helps us to make the best use of our talents.

The third servant had no love for his master, and so he was unfaithful and self-loving. He did not take the time and effort to truly know his master, therefore he could not serve him. When you know someone well, you will find it easy to love him, and when you love him, serving him becomes second nature. When love is absent, serving becomes extremely difficult.

Love is the only thing that motivates someone to give true service. Laziness is the result of a failure to love. And enduring stewardship is the only form of preparedness we can have for the Lord's unexpected arrival. For no one knows the day or the hour when the Lord will come like a thief in the night (cf Mt 24:42-43). As Christians, we must live in this tension through loving vigilance.

St Paul tells the Thessalonians, “we do not belong to the night or to darkness, so we should not go on sleeping” (1 Th 5: 5-6). We need to assiduously keep awake because “this eschatological coming could be accomplished at any moment, even if both it and the final trial that will precede it are ‘delayed’” (CCC 673).

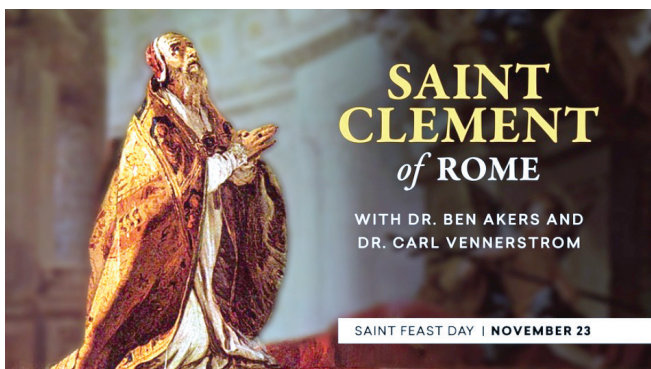

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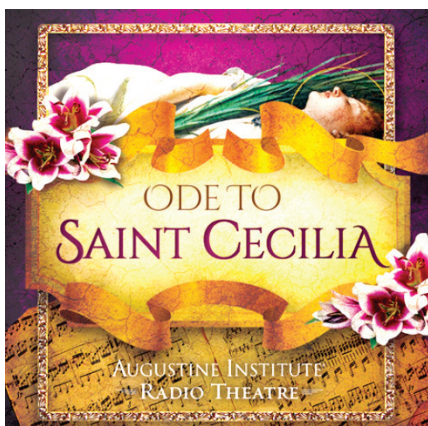
