Not Fast... Not Feast... But Hope

1st Sunday of Advent 3 Dec 2023

Is 63:16-17; 64:1, 3-8 1 Cor 1:3-9 Mk 13:33-37

Advent used to be called St Martin's Lent or the Nativity Fast with fasting three times a week from 11 November (St Martin's Feast) until Christmas as the norm. Pope St Gregory the Great later shortened the fast to four weeks to differentiate Advent from the forty days of Lent. Since the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), the penitential character of Advent has been accompanied by an eschatological hope. We are encouraged to strive to present ourselves worthily as people chosen by God and "joined... to his Son, Jesus Christ" (1 Cor 1:9) on judgement day. This communion with Christ is most perfectly effected in the Eucharist, "the source and summit of the Christian life" (CCC 1324). Advent is thus also a time of preparation for Christ's Second Coming or his Parousia - the day of the final or general judgement (CCC 1038).

While many of us may deeply desire a spiritual transformation this Advent, our work culture may demand that we feast and network to capitalise on the merriment stirred up by advertisers. This often conflicts with the silence, prayer and contemplation needed to enter interiorly where the Spirit awaits our presence, an attentive ear and an open heart. We should strive to free ourselves from some engagements so as to preserve this sacred time with our Lord and experience anew the hope, peace, joy and love that he has promised us.

On this First Sunday of Advent, the Church invites us to focus on Hope. We may be hoping to stop the wars that are being fought or the increase in human trafficking or modern slavery but where do we start and can the Christian understanding of Hope be of service to every single conflict and despair?

In his encyclical on the theological virtue of Hope, Pope Benedict XVI (whose first death anniversary we will commemorate on December 31), pointed out that Jesus brought hope to the world not through "social revolution like... Spartacus" or "political liberation like Barabbas" but through "something totally different: an encounter with the Lord of all lords, an encounter with the living God and thus an encounter with a hope stronger than the sufferings of slavery, a hope which therefore transformed life and the world from within... Even if external structures remained unaltered." (Spe Salvi, Saved in Hope 4)

Humanity truly encountered "the living God" some 2000 years ago when Jesus, the Second Person of the Trinity, became incarnate and was born into the world through our Blessed Mother. The Incarnation answered the cry in today's first reading for God to "tear the heavens open and come down" (Isa 63:19). In encountering God through Christ, "the impurity and sickness of our lives become evident to us [and] there

lies salvation. His gaze, the touch of his heart heals us ... enabling us to become totally ourselves and thus totally of God." (*Ibid* 47)

The Corinthian community experienced this intimate encounter with God and were praised by St Paul for continuing to manifest "the gifts of the Spirit" (1 Cor 1:7) and for building each other up in faith as they looked forward to only one event – and perhaps the most important event for every human being – "for the last day, the day of our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Cor 1:8).

Jesus urged us to live in such watchfulness in today's gospel. He tells us to "stay awake" (Mk 13:33, 35, 37) for "you do not know when the master of the house is coming, evening, midnight, cockcrow, dawn..." (Mk 13:35)

Let us set out this Advent with the right disposition of anticipating in faith and hope, Christ's final return and judgement. As we are also celebrating the Feast of St Francis Xavier this weekend, let us be zealous for Christ as he was and hope in Christ's mercy and grace as he did:

"O Jesus Christ my Redeemer, and from thy divine mercy, I hope that through Thy merits, assisted by Thy grace, I corresponding to this grace by good works, and fulfilling the precepts of Thy holy law, I shall one day come into the glory and happiness for which Thou has pleased to create and call me. Amen."



BOOKS ON ST FRANCIS XAVIER AT ST JEROME LIBRARY

2023 marks the 470th anniversary of the burial of St Francis Xavier's incorrupt body on St Paul's Hill in Malacca after he died on Sancian Island off the coast of mainland China on Dec 3, 1552. Over 10 years across India, South-east Asia and Japan, St Francis Xavier visited the sick in hospitals, arranged monetary collections for the poor, built churches, preached among the slums and villages, dialogued with Japanese Daimyos and other political leaders, celebrated Masses and baptised thousands. His zeal for Christ, the Church and his Jesuit Order has been captured in many books. In addition, St Francis Xavier wrote over two thousand letters to Goa, Malacca, Lisbon and Rome (including 5 letters signed off from "Straits of Singapore" dated between July 20




