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Will you allow God to be the joy of your life?

3rd Sunday of Advent 17 Dec 2023

lsa 61:1-2, 10-11 1 The 5:16-24 Jn 1:6-8, 19-28

Advent in our liturgical calendar is a penitential season that requires us to prepare our hearts with some personal sacrifices and penance in anticipation of the coming of our Lord. Today however, the Church celebrates the 3rd Sunday of Advent or Gaudete Sunday as the halfway mark leading up to Christmas.

Gaudete, in Latin, means "rejoice" and the Church today reflects this with the rose-coloured vestments and invites us to take a break from our self-denials and revel in a little pop of joy. Today is meant to uplift our spirits with joyful expectation of our Lord's Coming.

Today might be a good time to also pause and meditate on what joy means to us and what it is that we should be rejoicing over? A line from today's First Reading from the Prophet Isaiah perhaps best encapsulates the message of the Scriptures this Sunday: "God is the joy of my soul" (Isa 61:10). Yet how easy is it for us to replace "God" and complete the line with something else like success, money, honour, fame, sex or even our all-consuming hobby? Perhaps today we want to also rejoice with those who want to replace the "what" with the "who" that is God.

In supporting the common thread of rejoicing, our first reading from the prophet Isaiah announces the coming of the One who will bring healing and liberation to the poor, the broken-hearted and those in bondage. Coming too is the "year of the Lord's favour" that promises spiritual liberation for anyone who is imprisoned and shackled by sin or living a disordered life.

Yet as we wait for his Second Coming to fulfil the promise of salvation, Jesus already came and redeemed us! The healing and liberation we hope for is not going to come from the outside. Instead, the healing and release comes from God who works from within us. The Holy Spirit has already been implanted in our hearts and can transform us from the inside in the same way "the earth brings forth its plants, and a garden makes its growth spring up". God is never far from our innermost self, and if we allow him to, he can come and speak life, love and healing into our most hidden depths that only later do we notice that he has been at work in us all this while.



"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say rejoice.
Indeed, the Lord is near"
(Phil 4:4-5)

Perhaps this is reason enough to be joyful!

Thus, we grow into the attitude required of us from the second reading from Paul to the Thessalonians. Paul said that because we belong to Christ, joy should outweigh everything else in us and because we cannot heal and construct ourselves, we are called to "pray without ceasing" and "in all circumstances give thanks" and to make room for the Spirit to work.

Finally, in our Gospel from John, Jesus is presented to us as the fulfillment of the Old Testament and the culmination of the Word, the light that is coming into the world's darkness. John the Baptist whom many thought to be the Savior himself, in his humility distanced himself and announced that the one they seek is already among them but remains unrecognized. He was a simple instrument of God, a "voice crying in the wilderness" to "make straight the way of the Lord." His role was simply to point to the One that is to come (again).

John the Baptist was so happy just to be a voice saying, "There he is." This is what we are all called to be, and from our ordinary lives and circumstances in the world, to be a voice to all men — not just to this or that certain group — but to all the world. And so, may we develop a steadfast voice that gets truer and reach all through the world. With each day, may we speak out little voices of peace instead of conflict, of gentleness instead of spitefulness, of sweetness instead of bitterness and of acceptance instead of rejection.

As we celebrate Gaudete Sunday, perhaps this is the explanation of joy and what it means to rejoice - when we recognise the ways the Lord is present to us; let that inspire us to be for others just what he is to us.



ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The sacrament can be administered to any Catholic awaiting serious surgery, suffering from serious illness or weakened by old age. Anointing may be given before admission for the anticipated medical procedure. Contact the Parish Office to request for a priest. In emergencies, priests of the church nearest to the hospital can be contacted.

INFANT BAPTISM

Spiritual preparation is held on the last Friday of every odd month. Baptism is held on the first/second Sunday of the following month. For registration, please refer to our website.

FUNERAL

Please check with the Parish Office for priest availability and Mass timing before confirming the timing at the crematorium. For prayers at the wake, please contact the Parish Office.

MARRIAGE

Contact the Parish Office 12 months before your intended date to book the church premises and ensure that your presiding priest is able to make that date.

MASS OFFERING

Mass offering envelopes are available outside the Parish Office and outside JPII Hall. Submit your envelopes at least two weeks in advance of your intended date. Please write the names clearly, and in block letters.
