The Unveiling of God

The Epiphany of the Lord 5 Jan 2025

Is 60:1-6 Eph 3:2-3, 5-6 Mt 2:1-12

"In many and varied ways God spoke of old to our fathers by the prophets; but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom also he created the ages" (Heb 1:1-2). In his wisdom and goodness, God speaks to his creation through words and deeds which have an inner unity that no man can conjure. "[T]he deeds wrought by God in the history of salvation manifest and confirm the teaching and realities signified by the words, while the words proclaim the deeds and clarify the mystery contained in them." (cf. Dei Verbum 2) These revelations point to the birth of the Divine Messiah and are fulfilled in the life, suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Packed in today's readings are words and deeds that begin the unveiling of Jesus as the divine Son of God who would redeem not only the Israelites but all Gentiles like you and me.

Firstly, the Magi's visitation takes place in Bethlehem, the city of David from the tribe of Judah and where David was anointed king with a divine promise that someone from his lineage would rule the world forever. (cf. Gen 49:10, cf. Mt 1:3-6, cf. 2 Sam 7:12-14). With the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem, we begin to see the fulfilment of what God has promised. Even the very name Bethlehem is

a sign of the future - Bethlehem in Hebrew means the house of bread, pointing towards Jesus in the Eucharist, the bread of life.

Secondly, the star that guided the Magi, as described by St Matthew, is not quite an ordinary star. Some Church Fathers surmise that the star is, in reality, an angel in the guise of what looked like a star. The star also brings to mind the oracle of Balaam, a pagan prophesying in the time of Moses to Balak the king of Moab: "I see him, but not now; I behold him but not near: a star shall come forth out of Jacob, and a sceptre shall rise out of Israel." (cf. Num 24:17) Extrabiblical sources confirm that Balaam is a historical figure and his prophesy of a 'star' and a ruler coming from Jacob is likely well-known outside of Israel. This indeed may be the very reason why the Magi set out on a

perilous journey, determined to find the definitive King when they first saw the star. God speaks to pagans through a pagan seer, pointing them towards his Son, the Saviour of the world.

Thirdly, the prostrate Magi themselves before the child Jesus in a homage offered only to a divine king. Their gifts fulfil the prophesy of Isaiah from our first reading (cf. ls 60:6) and reflect their thoughts on the child Jesus - gold is a worthy gift for a king; frankincense, an incense, points to his divinity; while myrrh points to the Passion, also cited in John's Gospel as one of the ointments used to anoint the body of Jesus. (cf. Jn 19:39) The mystery of the Cross thus casts its shadow even at the very beginning of our Saviour's life.

Lastly, it is the non-Jewish Magi who find Jesus, not the priests and scribes in Herod's court who had the knowledge of Christ's birthplace but lacked the faith and perseverance to find it. This is indeed good news for all of us who are Gentiles. As long as we remain humble enough to hear what God has to say, we can find him as long as we obey his voice.

The Epiphany, which we celebrate today, is the "manifestation of Jesus as the Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Saviour of the World". (cf. CCC 528) It is a truth revealed by deeds and words from God; not an idea or notion conjured up in the mind of man, nor a thought arising from the wisdom of the world. Our Christian faith rests on this revealed truth that lesus is the Son of God who became man; suffered, died, and rose again to redeem all humanity - past, present, and future.
