"The Spirit of the Lord has been given to me"

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time 26 Jan 2025

Neh 8:2-6, 8-10 1 Cor 12: 12-30 Lk 1:1-4, 4:14-21

As we reflect on this weekend's readings, we are led into the law of the Lord and why we should rejoice in it. Prophet Nehemiah illustrates how encountering God's Word can evoke deep emotional and spiritual responses, leading to renewal and rejoicing. As we ponder on this week's readings, let us rejoice in the Good News of Jesus Christ and the new law he has laid in our hearts.

In the first reading, the prophet Nehemiah highlights to us how the old Law of the Lord was received by the people who listened and said: "'Amen! Amen!' Then they bowed down and, face to the ground, prostrated themselves before the Lord" (Neh 8:6). The people were truly touched by what the law meant to them and what the Lord was communicating to them. Their eyes were "all in tears as they listened to the words of the Law" (Neh 8:9). We can ask ourselves how many times we have been moved to tears by the law of the Lord and the words of Scripture. Have we bowed and prostrated ourselves before the Lord? In this modern world of constant communication, how many words have touched our hearts and made us cry?


In the second reading, St Paul emphasises the interdependence of the members of the Church, likening it to the different parts of the body. He illustrates the importance of each member of the Church and the necessity of unity and cooperation among its diverse parts. He states clearly: "The eye cannot say to the hand, 'I do not need you', nor can the head say to the feet, 'I do not need you" (1 Cor 12:21). His key message is: unity and diversity are essential to the life of the Church, since all of us are baptised and united by the same Spirit.

the Gospel, Jesus In is the culmination and the fulfilment of the Word of God concerning the Messiah. His mission brings about a new covenant, rooted in the same Scriptures that the people of Nehemiah's time revered. CCC 1966 explains that the new covenant brings about a higher law: "The new law is the grace of the Holy Spirit given to the faithful through faith in Christ". The fruit of the Holy Spirit is love: "The New Law is called a law of love because it makes us act out of the love infused by the Holy Spirit, rather than from fear" (CCC 1972). This new law puts into practice all our works of love, enabled by the grace bestowed by the Holy Spirit, so that we may understand our role in the church and our role in the world. We should not be afraid to live life in the Holy Spirit.

Jesus said in the synagogue: "The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for he has anointed me" (Lk 4:16). Jesus confirms what his mission on earth is; to give us a new law that will not just be written in the scrolls and in books but in our hearts. We are no longer poor and

blind; we can see and now we can also live our life in the Holy Spirit and act in love as we have been given a great gift. After Jesus had preached and sat down, he said to the people "This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen" (Lk 4:21). He tells us these very words today as we sit in the pews of our own church.

As we go about our lives, we can become deaf and blind to the words of the Lord, thus, let us take some time to rejoice in this new law we have been given and to live our lives in the Holy Spirit. Live in charity with others and ourselves so that we can truly be who God meant us to be.



What is Sunday of the Word of God?

Sunday of the Word of God is a celebration instituted by Pope Francis in 2019 through his Apostolic Letter *Aperuit Illis*, to emphasise the importance of sacred Scripture in the life of the Church and of every Christian. The day is celebrated on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time.

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Read the Word.
Consume the Word until
it consumes you.
Believe the Word.
Act on the Word.

Pope Francis instituted this day to encourage Catholics to develop a closer relationship with the Bible and to emphasise that God's Word is at the centre of the Church's life and mission.

In the Gospel according to Matthew 4:4, Jesus quotes Deuteronomy 8:3, saying, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.' This emphasises the essential role of God's Word in nourishing our spiritual life.

St. Jerome, a Church Father, famously said, 'Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ.' This highlights the importance of being familiar with sacred Scripture to deepen our relationship with Christ.



Pope Benedict XVI, in his apostolic exhortation *Verbum Domini*, stressed the need for a deepened appreciation of the Word of God, highlighting that listening to and meditating on Scripture is essential for Christian life.

The celebration takes its name from Luke 24:45, where the risen Jesus "opened their minds to understand the Scriptures." Through this annual observance, the Church seeks to remind the faithful that regular engagement with Scripture is essential for spiritual growth and understanding of the faith.

"For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and spirit, of joints and marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart."

RCIY Retreat

From 10 to 12 Jan, the SFX RCIY participants gathered for their second retreat - on the theme of attachments, based on the encounter of the Samaritan woman with Jesus in John 4. The participants were led to reflect on their everyday attachments, and to recognise those that might be unhealthy and disordered. Jesus reveals to the Samaritan woman that he comes to offer us living water, a spring that wells up to eternal life. Jesus also thirsts - not for the water at the well, but for our love and devotion, as he expressed on the cross. Ultimately, the focus was on how God comes to free his people from these attachments which brings no life, and to learn to grow dependent on him from whom all life comes.

The retreat was a wonderful time of prayer, spiritual input from Scripture, games and fellowship.

I learnt more about my attachments and how God can take away these attachments. I feel much closer to God especially after writing a letter to him.
