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Love: Our Call to Holiness


5th Sunday in Ordinary Time 9 Feb 2025

ls 6:1-2a, 3-8 1 Cor 15:1-11 Lk 5:1-11

In the upcoming week, the world will be celebrating Valentine's Day. With shops and restaurants advertising special deals for this occasion, 'love' can easily be perceived as transactional. However, as baptised Christians, 'love' is beyond that - it is our primary vocation. It is the Call to Holiness, as Pope Paul VI describes in Lumen Gentium - a call to love God with our whole heart, soul, mind and strength so that we may love each other as he loves us (cf. LG 40). Our readings today prompt us to consider the obstacles that might prevent us from genuinely upholding this vocation.

The main obstacle is sin, which "sets itself against God's love for us and turns our hearts away from it" (CCC 1850). The First Reading emphasises the importance of removing sin before we can be sent out on mission. When Isaiah recognised his own wretchedness, God then came to his aid through the Seraphim (cf. Is 6:6). This encounter illustrates God's infinite merciful love for us. Although we will continually sin, he offers to restore his friendship with us through the sacrament of reconciliation (Fr Antonio Fuentes, Opus Dei, January 1992). On our part, we need to humbly acknowledge our sins and shortcomings. As we seek to grow our relationship with God, St Paul reminds us to remain with scripture, where the truth of God's love that "Christ died for our sins" (1 Cor 15:3), will firmly establish us in our call.

Sin can also lead to feelings of unworthiness. St Paul mentions that he too faced this, but encourages us to trust in God's grace as this was what strengthened him: "I hardly deserve the name apostle; but by God's grace that is what I am" (1 Cor 15:9-10). Grace is "free and undeserved help that God gives us to respond to his call" (CCC 1996), which can be obtained through the sacraments. The First Reading highlights that Isaiah was only able to respond to God's call to be his messenger after the Seraphim had brought the burning coal to him (cf. Is 6:5-8). In his exhortation On the Orthodox Faith, St John of Damascus wrote that the 'burning coal' prophetically signified the transformative power Eucharist to purify and commission us to be witnesses of the Word of God whenever we receive him. Thus,



we can turn to Jesus in the Eucharist to strengthen us. Additionally, we have to cooperate with grace by trying to nurture this ability to love in our day-to-day lives. Pope Francis suggests in *Gaudete et Exultate* that through small gestures, the holiness which the Lord calls us to will grow (cf. *GE* 16). For instance, we can help a stranger in need or refrain from gossiping. As long as we rely on and cooperate with grace to guide our lives, we will be equipped for this mission.

Admittedly, there will still be moments when we lack complete confidence, but God invites us to put whatever faith we have in him. We can follow Simon's [Peter] example in the Gospel. While he was washing his nets after an unsuccessful night of fishing, Jesus approached him and instructed him to try again (cf. Lk 5:4-5). Simon seemed to recognise that Jesus was someone with authority, and obeyed his instructions despite it being contrary to his own logic. His obedience resulted in his and his companions' nets being overwhelmingly full. Similarly, when we respond to lesus' invitation to be 'fishers of men' (cf. Lk 5:10), we will be able to live meaningful and purposeful lives for him and for others. He generously extends his love and providence to those whom we entrust to him. It may seem like a huge undertaking to follow him, but Jesus assures us: "Do not be afraid" (Lk 5:10).


Holiness is a call for all. May we rely on God's grace to guide us so that we can confidently respond: "Here I am Lord, send me!" (Is 6:8).

On 26 Jan, approximately 135 participants – including Level 9 Catechetical candidates, parents, and godparents – gathered at the SFX Auditorium for the Covenant Ritual. This para-liturgy served as a poignant reminder of the candidates' baptism, recalling the symbolic significance of water as a means of cleansing and renewal. It also reaffirmed their threefold baptismal calling as priest, prophet, and king.

Before the para-liturgy commenced, the Level 9 Catechetical Coordinator provided a short catechesis on the meaning of the covenant, its connection to baptism, and the call to missionary discipleship. The candidates were encouraged to embrace this journey through daily prayer, scripture reading, regular confession, and weekly Sunday Mass – commitments expressed in the Discipleship Commitment Card.

During the para-liturgy, time was set aside for parents and godparents to share personal reflections on their own Sacraments of Initiation and how these encounters with Christ have shaped their lives. In turn, the candidates shared their aspirations and vision for their faith journey as they prepared to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. One of the highlights was a moving testimony by Jane Lee, who shared how she encountered God's unconditional love through the vocation of motherhood.

The ritual culminated in a powerful moment when parents poured water over their child's hands – a symbolic act of renewal – before the candidates pinned their Discipleship Commitment Cards onto the Discipleship Commitment Board. Each card contained a personal prayer written by their parents or godparents, affirming their support for the candidate's discipleship journey. The Commitment Board now stands as a visible sign of encouragement, reminding the Level 9 batch to walk together in faith, and support one another in their mission as disciples of Christ.

Let us continue to pray for these young candidates as they deepen their commitment to Christ and his Church.

"Attending the covenant ritual as we stood before God together with the church community, we are reminded that we are not alone in our spiritual journey. Our family and the church community are here to support and guide us. Most importantly, the Holy Spirit is with us, equipping us with wisdom, strength, and courage to live out our faith daily. 
