Lent - A Time of Preparation

1st Sunday in Lent 9 Mar 2025

Deut 26:4-10 Rom 10:8-13 Lk 4:1-13

It's the beginning of Lent, and this time you're ready. You've planned your unique Lenten sacrifices, decided what alms to give, and how to deepen your prayer life.

"This is going to be a good Lent. This time, I will succeed!" You say this to yourself, determined to overcome the memories of unkept resolutions of past Lenten commitments.

Sounds familiar? I'm sure we've all been there. But perhaps this Lent, we are invited to shift our focus away from the "success" or "failure" we experience in sticking to our commitments, and instead focus on how we are growing and being moulded more into the likeness of Christ through the *process* of doing so. In other words, perhaps the invitation is to make our endeavours less about ourselves, and more about imitating Christ and becoming more like him.

In today's Gospel, we are told of the temptations of Jesus, who had been fasting in the wilderness for 40 days. In his extreme hunger, weakness and exhaustion, the devil tempts Jesus to yield to his human frailty. Jesus however, as the perfect man, combats the devil's assaults with a resolved reliance on the Word of God, and ultimately prevails even under the most unfavourable circumstances.

But of course, none of us are perfect, and we are bound to fail

and succumb to temptations during our life here on earth - what then is the point? If we are bound to fail, why try at all? I would suggest that a shift in focus from a "success/failure mindset" to a mindset of preparation and strengthening may help us to have a more fruitful experience this Lenten season.

Lent is a time of preparation and strengthening of our faith.

If we look closer at the context of the Gospel reading, we see that the temptations in the wilderness take place right after Jesus' baptism and just before he embarks on his public ministry. Over the next three years, Jesus would endure rejection and persecution, and persevere through immense suffering during his passion, when he ultimately offers his life as a sacrifice for each and every one of us. Through it all, however, Jesus remains steadfast in his convictions and resolute in accomplishing the Father's will.

When viewed in this context, the time of lesus' temptations in the wilderness was not just a time of testing or needless suffering, but a time of preparation for what was to come. In detaching himself from even basic necessities of food, warmth and shelter, Jesus strengthened his human body and will to remain steadfast and convicted in the face of temptation and persecution, knowing that the road ahead would be fraught with challenges and obstacles to the accomplishment of the most holy will of the Father.

Similarly, in Lent, we are invited to lay down our worldly attachments through fasting and almsgiving; to part with the things that we have become quick to rely on for comfort, security and control, and to train ourselves in radical reliance on the providence and sovereignty of God. The point then is not to "succeed" at fasting and giving alms, but to, through these, and a reliance on prayer, grow deeper in relationship with God in this period of "detachment".

Indeed, as Pope Francis stated in his Lenten Message for 2024: "For this reason, prayer, almsgiving and fasting are not three unrelated acts, but a single movement of openness and self-emptying, in which we cast out the idols that weigh us down, the attachments that imprison us. Then the atrophied and isolated heart will revive."

May we therefore approach this Lenten season with hope - that through the little sacrifices we choose to make for the Lord, we may grow in love of him. And that in doing so, no "failure" - "nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Rom 8:39).

MINISTRY AWARENESS & OUTREACH DRIVE


'The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.' - Luke 10:2


Spiritual Reading for Lent from St Jerome Library


Prayer and stillness are important practices the Church has encouraged us to take on in Lent. In slowing down, we can then be open and free to hear our Lord speak to us and lead us.


Come by St Jerome Library to pick up a book or two and set aside time for yourself and also with your children to read and enjoy time with our Lord.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK



The sacrament can be administered to any Catholic awaiting serious surgery, suffering from serious illness or weakened by old age. Anointing may be given before admission for the anticipated medical procedure. Contact the Parish Office to request for a priest. In emergencies, priests of the church nearest to the hospital can be contacted.

INFANT BAPTISM
