We Can Be Free!

3rd Sunday in Lent
23 Mar 2025

Ex 3:1-8, 13-15
1 Cor 10:1-6, 10-12
Lk 13:1-9

How convicted are we of the changing power of God in our lives?

As we have reflected over the past two weeks, Lent is a season of preparation, of change, and of freedom from the things that enslave us. But as we have realised from going through many seasons of Lent, change is never easy, and we find ourselves running back to the same 'comfortable' sins that enslave us. But we are not meant to surrender to failure, for there is a way forward.

In our Gospel, we can identify two sides of the same coin. The first part speaks of how suffering is not only given to those who are guilty or have sinned, but it could come to anyone. Here, Jesus breaks the notion that calamity only comes to people who are deserving of it, while those who live good and just lives are spared. The reality, as I am sure we have all experienced, is that we may face challenges and hardships even when we try our best to remain close to the Lord. This does not mean that our attempts at holiness are futile, but it serves as a reminder of the presence of sin and evil in our world.

The second part of the Gospel responds to the first: "leave it one more year and give me time to dig round it and manure it: it may bear fruit next year; if not, then you can

cut it down" (Lk 13:9). Who do we identify as Jesus in the exchange? Do we see Jesus as the one who is asking for the fig tree to be cut down, while we are pleading for another year? Or do we see Jesus as the one who protects us from being cut down? Pope Francis, in his *Angelus*, highlights that "[God] does not look at the achievements you have not yet reached, but the fruits you can still bear" (2022). Even while we may be in a difficult season, we are not cut off from God's mercy. We are called to move with the Lord and grow in holiness as we move, rather than stay in our struggles.

Our struggles and sins should not serve as judgements that we are bad people, but reminders of who God has made us to be and how far we have strayed from that identity. Like what St Paul wrote in the Second Reading, the mistakes made by their ancestors serve as warnings for them (cf. 1 Cor 10:11). In the same way, our sins, past and present, should serve as warnings to us on how far we are straying from God. Likewise, even if we feel that we are close to God, we should remain alert, as "The man who thinks he is safe must be careful that he does not fall" (1 Cor 10:12).

Our freedom from the sins that enslave us can only be redeemed through God. This assurance echoes in the First Reading and should echo in our hearts today: "And the Lord said, 'I have seen the miserable state of my people in Egypt. I have heard their appeal to be free of their slave-drivers. Yes, I am well aware of their sufferings. I mean to deliver them out of the hands of the Egyptians and bring them up out of that land to a land rich and broad, a land

where milk and honey flow" (Ex 3:7-8). The Lord knows the challenges and hardships that we are in, and he desires to free us. But we can only be free from the sins that enslave us when we desire to do so and rely on God's strength. Our free will allows us to also choose our own sinfulness, as much as we can also choose God.

We can only turn away from sin when we place our lives in God's hands and be convicted of his power. The same God who changed the hearts of the sinners to become saints is the same God who is calling for us to return home.

Rites of Sending and Election

Across two Sundays in March, 40 catechumens and candidates from the SFX RCIA and RCIY, together with their godparents, underwent and witnessed the Rites of Sending and Election on 2nd and 9th March respectively.

The Rite of Sending, marking the transition in one's faith journey from catechumen to Elect, was incorporated into the Sunday mass celebrated by Father Ben. The Rite involved the godparents of catechumens and candidates affirming their readiness to be presented to His Eminence William Cardinal Goh.

The Rite of Election was hosted by the Church of the Holy Family and Blessed Sacrament Church this year. SFX and other parishes descended on The Church of the Holy Family, where catechumens, after being affirmed by their godparents and the community, were presented to His Eminence and had the opportunity to sign their names in the Book of Elect.

These twin Rites represent an important crossing in the journey towards baptism and signify a growing spiritual depth and maturity in our now-Elect and candidates. Let us, as a community in Christ, continue our prayers for them!
