## Hope Does Not Disappoint

5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent  
6 Apr 2025

Is 43:16 – 21  
Phil 3:8 – 14  
Jn 8:1 – 11

In recent years, Singapore has made mental health a national priority. Compounded by COVID-19, the nation is facing a crisis of anxiety, depression and burnout — especially among youths and working adults. In response, the government launched Singapore's National Mental Health and Well-Being Strategy and other initiatives to improve access to care, reduce stigma and build resilience through schools, workplaces and community programmes.

Still, many feel alone and unheard. Mental health stigma remains, and many carry their burdens in silence. Beneath the symptoms lies a deeper ache — a loss of hope, a feeling of being overwhelmed and the weight of inadequacy in a culture that values success and perfection.

The readings provide an uplifting approach to managing our trials and tribulations. In the Gospel, the woman caught in adultery is dragged into public shame and used as a pawn. She stood condemned. Yet at that moment, she received not judgement, but mercy. Jesus saw her dignity beyond her failure. He didn't dismiss her sin, but neither did he define her by it. Instead, he offered her a new beginning: "Go, and sin no more" (Jn 8:11).

This is a radical message of hope. For the burdened and unworthy, Jesus doesn't throw stones. He restores and invites us to live again. In a world where many suffer in silence, the Gospel reminds us that failure isn't final. Jesus sees beyond our wounds and offers healing.

Even saints walked this road — among them, Blessed *Enrico Rebuschini* battled years of depression and was beatified. His life shows holiness is possible amid struggles.

The First Reading echoes this hope: "No need to recall the past, ... See, I am doing a new deed" (Is 43:18-19). God reminds his people that he is not just the God of past miracles, but the God of the present and future. He is making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.

This does not mean we ignore or forget the blessings of our past. As St. Ignatius writes in paragraph [235] of the *Spiritual Exercises*, we are called to recall God's blessings with deep affection and gratitude. However, Isaiah reminds us not to become stuck in the past — whether wounds, regrets, or even glories — because God is always active, always doing something new in our lives. We are called to perceive and receive his present grace.

In the Second Reading, St. Paul presses on: "I forget the past and I strain ahead for what is still to come" (Phil 3:13). His message is clear — our past doesn't define our future. Despite trials, we press forward toward God's upward calling in Christ.

Don't let struggles rob you of what lies ahead. In a society where worth is tied to image and success, Christ's

call is countercultural — our true value is rooted in his love, not in what we achieve.

As Lent deepens, prayer, fasting and almsgiving reveal our weaknesses and attachments. Yet nearing Easter, they become acts of hope — turning us back to God and grace. Lent reminds us that, despite everything, transformation is possible and mercy is near.

Pope Francis, in his Bull of Indiction for the Jubilee Year 2025 titled *Spes Non Confundit* (*Hope Does Not Disappoint*), invites us to be 'pilgrims of hope'. In a world marked by conflict, suffering and disillusionment, he reminds us that hope is not naive optimism, but a firm anchor rooted in God's love. He writes in paragraph 3: "Christian hope does not deceive or disappoint because it is grounded in the certainty that nothing and no one may ever separate us from God's love."

As we continue this Lenten journey, let us hold fast to this truth: whether we're battling mental health challenges, facing failure, or simply feeling tired — hope is not lost. Christ does not condemn us. He walks with us, calls us by name, and invites us to live again. In him, hope does not disappoint.

# L10 Retreat

31 teens from the Church of St Bernadette (CSB) and 50 teens from our parish attended a combined L10 retreat from 15 - 17 March. The aim of this retreat was to provide a space for them to encounter the Holy Spirit and to inspire them to actively live out their faith as witnesses to others. Apart from the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Eucharistic Adoration, there were sessions on the fruits and gifts of the Holy Spirit leading to praying over our teens for the empowerment of the Holy Spirit. It was truly wonderful to see our teens growing in maturity. During the times of silent adoration, they were able to sit and pray without too much prompting.
