Source of Living Hope

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity
15 Jun 2025

Prov 8:22-31
Rom 5:1-5
Jn 16:12-15

"What is God's will for me?" - This question may have popped up in our minds during unexpected moments in life. The next step may have been to search for logical explanations for its occurrence. However, if there was no concrete reason, we may be left with despair. Today's Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity reminds us to approach such matters in our lives like how we are to approach God - with faith. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches: "The mystery of the Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life ... It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them..." (CCC 234). Hence, we can look to the Holy Trinity as the perfect model for how to live life with faith to illuminate the areas of our lives that seem beyond comprehension.

Firstly, we can entrust our situation to Jesus. The Wisdom of God described in the First Reading refers to Jesus, who, together with God the Father, created the world (cf. Prov 8:29-30). Since Jesus had called us his friends earlier in John's Gospel, this love that they have for each other extends to us too (Jn 15:15; cf. Jn 16:15). Hence, we can be assured that God, who has been with us from the beginning, will never leave us. Jesus also promises his disciples that when it is too much to comprehend, he will send

the Spirit of truth to guide them (cf. Jn 16:13). This same spirit, who was given to us in Baptism and Confirmation, will guide us as long as we trust in him completely (cf. CCC 1316). Pope Leo XIV shared this sentiment during his *Regina Caeli* address on 25 May 2025: "This dwelling of God within us ... is precisely the gift of the Holy Spirit, who takes us by the hand and enables us to experience God's presence and closeness amid our daily lives, for he makes us his home." While we cannot predict the future, we can be certain that God dwells in us and accompanies us through the Holy Spirit.

Secondly, we can pray for the grace of humility to let go of our desire to handle the situation on our own. By faith, we can then find peace in God through Jesus Christ (cf. Rom 5:1). This peace would provide calm and strength to guide us through challenges. Additionally, we will be able to grow in endurance as we withstand such hardships, which lays the foundation of building character (cf. Rom 5:3-4). We can then experience a hope "grounded in the certainty that nothing and no one may ever separate us from God's love." (*Spes Non Confundit*, Pope Francis, 9 May 2024). Having this Christian hope keeps our hearts from dwelling on "what ifs" and orients it towards truth, which is all that the Spirit shares with us from the Father (cf. Jn 16:15). To be enlightened by the Spirit, we need to have an active and growing relationship with God by remaining in his word (cf. CCC 2653).

Lastly, we can continue to nurture this flame of hope by being attentive to those in need. While we exist to be in a relationship with God by virtue of our Baptism (cf. CCC 1265), we are also gifts to others. With the Holy Spirit

pouring God's love into our hearts (cf. Rom 5:5), as disciples we are also called to pour that love into others. St Augustine reiterates the importance of the Trinitarian love being visible to others: "Wherever there is love, there is a Trinity: A Lover, A Beloved, and a Fountain of Love." If we live our lives with Christian hope, others may be inspired to have hope again and search for the same hope that sustains us.

As we return to the season of Ordinary Time, let us allow the Trinity to gently lead us in the simplicity of day-to-day life, so that our lives may serve as testimonies of Christian hope.
