Bread for the World

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)
22 Jun 2025

Gen 14:18-20
1 Cor 11:23-26
Lk 9:11-17

The Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) today, honouring the profound mystery of the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist, despite its external appearance as bread and wine. This grand solemnity reminds us that Christ is always with us in the here and now, fully alive in the Eucharist.

The reception of Holy Communion transforms and unites us to Christ and his Church. It "renews, strengthens, and deepens this incorporation into the Church, already achieved by Baptism" (CCC 1396). The more we receive the Eucharist worthily, the more we are transformed into the *imago dei* (image of God). It deepens our union with Christ, assures us of eternal life and empowers us to live as missionary disciples.

Yet there is much more to this sacrament. Pope Benedict XVI writes, "Our communities, when they celebrate the Eucharist, must become ever more conscious that the sacrifice of Christ is for all, and that the Eucharist thus compels all who believe in him to become "bread that is broken" for others, and to work for the building of a more just and fraternal world" (*Sacramentum Caritatis*, 88).


Keeping in mind today's gospel story, we are reminded that Christ exhorts us, his disciples, to be personally engaged: "Give them something to eat yourselves" (Lk 9:13). Each of us is truly called, together with Jesus, to be bread broken for the life of the world. Like Melchizedek in the First Reading, who blessed Abram, we pray to bless others through acts of charity and service.

What does this look like in practical terms? CCC 1397 spells out very clearly our obligations in no uncertain terms: "The Eucharist commits us to the poor. To receive in truth the Body and Blood of Christ given up for us, we must recognize Christ in the poorest, his brethren."

CCC 1397 goes on to quote St. John Chrysostom to reinforce this assertion: "You have tasted the Blood of the Lord, yet you do not recognize your brother, . . . You dishonor this table when you do not judge worthy of sharing your food [with] someone judged worthy to take part in this meal. . . . God freed you from all your sins and invited you here, but you have not become more merciful (Hom. in 1 Cor. 27, 4: PG 61, 229-230; cf. Mt 25:40).

This goes further than the familiar reminder to Christians to love and care for the poor. To say 'the Eucharist commits us to the poor' frames it in sacramental theology — and tells us that when we consciously live this out, divine graces flow. Something more happens than just the meeting of a physical need. Perhaps that is what the miraculous multiplication of loaves led to — not just to the sharing of abundant food to feed the hungry, but a sharing of lives; we are told the crowd 'all ate as much as they wanted' (Mt 15:37).

The Eucharist, as a source of grace, is meant to transform the



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believer's heart and inspire a life of service, thereby fostering a deeper relationship with Christ and with the community. In giving our 'Amen' when we receive Jesus in the Eucharist therefore, we are saying our yes to our union with him, and committing also to generously share all that we receive from the Eucharist with the world in need — graces, gifts and God's own abundance. The Eucharist gives us a foretaste of the heavenly banquet that awaits those who are faithful.

Who are the poor and hungry amongst us who need the Lord? Let us ponder deeply how we might 'give them something ourselves'. Having received the Eucharist, we are sent on mission after every mass to bring his love to the world. Let us heed the Church's call to share the Living Christ generously.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

INFANT BAPTISM

Spiritual preparation is held on the last Friday of every odd month. Baptism is held on the first/second Sunday of the following month. For registration, please refer to our website.



FUNERAL

Please check with the Parish Office for priest availability and Mass timing before confirming the timing at the crematorium. For prayers at the wake, please contact the Parish Office.



MARRIAGE

Contact the Parish Office 12 months before your intended date to book the church premises and ensure that your presiding priest is able to make that date.



MASS OFFERING

Mass offering envelopes are available outside the Parish Office and outside JPPII Hall. Submit your envelopes at least two weeks in advance of your intended date. Please write the names clearly, and in block letters.
