At Peace in God's Lap

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time 6 Jul 2025

ls 66:10-14 Gal 6:14-18 Lk 10:1-12, 17-20

Today's readings answer two questions that are especially relevant in this troubled world: Why is it that despite much progress and improvement in living conditions and material comfort, there is still strife and conflict around us, and what can be done about it?

The answer to the first is complicated if you think only in secular terms but it is straightforward for those who have faith — peace cannot be found outside of God. No matter how hard we try, how much progress we make or how progressive our civilisation is, there will always be irreconcilable differences between men. It is part of the human condition that is beyond human resolution. Yet, people continue to believe it is within their power to do so, and in the selfish rush to improve their lot, they become even more divided and dissatisfied. God alone can offer peace because that is who he is. He is peace itself and in his infinite love, he offers it as a gift to us.

The First Reading illustrates this in vivid and touching imagery: "Now towards her I send flowing peace, like a river ... At her breast will her nurslings be carried and fondled in her lap. Like a son comforted by his mother will I comfort you. And by Jerusalem you will be comforted" (Is 66:12-13).

The idea that peace comes from God is so alien to many in the world, that

it requires this picture of us sitting on God's lap as his children, to be nursed and comforted, to convey this truth. What do we need to do to attain it? Because of man's fallen nature, Christ entered the world to save us from our sins. Our search for peace can come only through him.

In the Second Reading, St Paul puts it this way: "The only thing I can boast about is the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom the world is crucified to me, and I to the world. It does not matter if a person is circumcised or not; what matters is for him to become an altogether new creature" (Gal 6:14-15).

Attaining peace through Jesus requires us to change and become a completely new person living a life of integrity and truth, committed to God and his will. But the world can be peaceful only if enough people believe this and do their part. We are thus called to be messengers of peace, following on the example set by the seventy-two whom our Lord appointed for the task, as recounted in the Gospel reading.

He knows it is not easy which is why he gave clear instructions on how to proceed: Carry no purse or haversack, or even sandals. Stay in the same house, not move from one to another, and not expect any special treatment but to eat and drink what is offered.

What happened when they returned from this mission? They came back rejoicing: "Lord, even the devils submit to us when we use your name" (Lk 10:17).

Being messengers of peace and love is hard work and the outcome can only be assured when it is undertaken by a wider and united community, which is what the 72 disciples represent.

This is why it is important to support the work of the Church, to grow and strengthen its reach to spread the message of Jesus, the prince of peace. Our individual acts of kindness and encouragement to others to carry out the Lord's mission are important but so is our work to support the Church.

Pope Leo XIV in his homily during his first public Mass stressed this important point.

"It is essential to do this, first of all, in our personal relationship with the Lord, in our commitment to a daily journey of conversion. Then, to do so as a Church, experiencing together our fidelity to our Lord and bringing the Good news to all." (Pope Leo XIV, homily, 9 May 2025).


INTERCESSORY

A Historic L9 Retreat

Across Three Parishes

For the first time in our parish's history, the Church of Saint Francis Xavier held a combined L9 Retreat with the Church of the Risen Christ and the Church of St Bernadette. A total of 131 teens were ministered to by 107 service team members as speakers, facilitators, intercessors and logistics members from across the three parishes.



Centred on the theme "Jesus Heals the Haemorrhaging Woman" (Mark 5:25–34), the retreat led the teens into a profound encounter with the Lord through the many inspiring teachings and testimonies, Sacrament of Reconciliation, praise and worship, a praying-with session, and Eucharistic Adoration.

Parents also participated in two dedicated sessions. In one session, Brother Alex, a seminarian currently attached to Church of the Risen Christ, shared a meaningful teaching using the Holy Family as a model — reminding us that holiness does not require perfection. The session also featured a moving testimony from a couple who shared how the Lord healed and transformed their marriage through His grace.
