For Our Hope is in the Lord

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time 13 Jul 2025

Deut 30:10-14 Col 1:15-20 Lk 10:25-37

Today's Gospel recounts the parable of the good Samaritan. A common reflection on the parable is that it invites us, like the good Samaritan, to serve, help and care for the downtrodden, the overlooked and those in need. This is indeed the call that Christ extends to each of us as Christians.

However, perhaps today the Lord invites us into a slightly deeper reflection on this parable and on our own lives.

Before Jesus tells the parable of the good Samaritan, he engages in a conversation with a lawyer who is trying to test him. In their exchange, Jesus affirms "[w]hat is written in the law" – that to inherit eternal life, "[y]ou must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbour as yourself" (Lk 10:26-27).

What is striking here is that the call to be like the good Samaritan is not just a call to kindness – it is a call to fulfil "what is written in the law". In loving and serving the downtrodden and those in need, we not only love our neighbour as ourselves, but also reflect the love that we have for the Lord. As St John writes: "If anyone says, 'I love God,' and hates

his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen" (1 Jn 4:20).

The call of today's Gospel is not simply to "be nice" or "help out", but to love others with the same love that the Lord has shown towards us. This is a deep, self-sacrificing, patient love – one that bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, and endures all things (cf. 1 Cor 13: 4-7).

The Samaritan's act in today's parable is no small feat. The road from Jerusalem to Jericho was notorious for rough, barren and rocky terrain spanning over approximately 15 miles; as a result of this, travellers on this route were vulnerable targets to bandits. By extending aid to the wounded man, the Samaritan placed himself at

significant risk to his own life and limb during an already perilous journey. He didn't just offer quick aid – he gave his time, his safety, his money (approximately two days' wages) to care for the man, and even committed to cover future expenses for his continued care.

Seen in this way, the call of today's Gospel is for our love to go far beyond what is convenient and easily within our means – to meet people at their place of need, and to give of ourselves out of love for God and his people, even at significant cost and risk to ourselves.

This can feel overwhelming, especially when we are already burdened with our own challenges and crosses that we ourselves have to bear and overcome. It is thus not unexpected that many of us feel disheartened and see the demands of the faith as something out of reach and unattainable.

But the Lord today invites us to hope in him. He reminds us that we need not fear failure, because his abundant grace and mercy are sufficient. As Moses declares in today's first reading: "[T]his Law... is not beyond your strength or beyond your reach... No, the Word is very near to you, it is in your mouth and in your heart for your observance" (Deut 30:11-14).

As we begin this new week, let us strive to love as the Lord has loved us – with our whole heart, soul and strength – in spite of the discomfort and hardship that may follow. And let us place our hope in the Lord, through whom all things are possible and in whom all perfection is found.

SALT Retreat: Pilgrims of Hope in Community

SaLT (Servants at the Lord's Table), a community that aims to reflect Christ's image and light, with a mission of Disciples Making Disciples, has just celebrated its eighth anniversary.

In a recent retreat held at Changi Cove on 27 – 29 Jun, 19 Salters (as they are called), came together to be 'Pilgrims of Hope in Community'. Led by Sr Bubbles from the Cenacle Sisters, the retreat was a reminder of what it means to be disciples in a community, growing in faith together.

Col 3:12-15 sums up what we are called to do: "As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful."





"During the SaLT retreat, I was grateful for the time to be away with the Lord to grow personally and spiritually. There was a sense of timelessness as it was an opportunity to reflect and chill. I also treasured the time to connect and bond with fellow pilgrims or Salters on the same faith journey. First, we recognised our gifts and shared them with one another. As we shared in our triad group sharing, we were also affirmed in turn.

As everyone comes with their own level of spirituality, we were made aware to give one another space to grow in faith on this journey as pilgrims.

This retreat made evident that there is so much of love and care for one another. We will also remember to show more kindness to each other which gives hope for the future of this community." **Serafin Fernandez**

"In this year's retreat, we went much deeper, and I felt more connected to the theme as Sr Bubbles challenged us to reflect on what our community meant. It became clear that this retreat wasn't just about an individual's personal reflection but a collective one. What struck me most was the focus on kindness







being kind in our interactions, sharings, and discussions. I found myself questioning my place in this community – whether I'm truly a pilgrim, a sojourner, or just a tourist who comes and goes depending

on my circumstances. It made me realise how fluid my role can be, and how I fluctuate between these identities depending on what's going on in my life. When the concept of MAGIS was introduced, I knew I had to reflect on the call for us to live with greater purpose and to give our best selves for the greater good. It pushed me to think about how I can use my strengths, time, and resources — not just for myself, but to make a bigger impact on others. In that moment, my own MAGIS became clear: to offer my best self to my community, and to bring more love, service, and impact into the world around me.

One of the most emotional parts of the retreat was the 'Iceberg Challenge' which forced us to confront the deeper, often unspoken parts of what went on in the community. It gave us a space to openly share our hurts and unresolved emotions from the past. I felt the weight of the shared vulnerability in the room and how, through this openness, we were able to heal together. In a world that often feels divided, the retreat was a powerful reminder of the importance of kindness, compassion, and support for one another — no judgment, just prayer and presence." Andrew Toh

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The sacrament can be administered to any Catholic awaiting serious surgery, suffering from serious illness or weakened by old age. Anointing may be given before admission for the anticipated medical procedure. Contact the Parish Office to request for a priest. In emergencies, priests of the church nearest to the hospital can be contacted.

INFANT BAPTISM

Spiritual preparation is held on the last Friday of every odd month. Baptism is held on the first/second Sunday of the following month. For registration, please refer to our website.

FUNERAL

Please check with the Parish Office for priest availability and Mass timing before confirming the timing at the crematorium. For prayers at the wake, please contact the Parish Office.

MARRIAGE

Contact the Parish Office 12 months before your intended date to book the church premises and ensure that your presiding priest is able to make that date.

MASS OFFERING

Mass offering envelopes are available outside the Parish Office and outside JPII Hall. Submit your envelopes at least two weeks in advance of your intended date. Please write the names clearly, and in block letters.
