The Gift of **Christ's Glory**

7th Sunday of Easter 24 May 2020

Ac 1:12-14 1 Pt 4:13-16 Jn 17:1-11

We have just celebrated the Ascension - "the irreversible entry of [Christ's] humanity into divine glory." Our Lord now "intercedes constantly for us as the mediator who assures us of the permanent outpouring of the Holy Spirit." (CCC 659 & 667).

Christ's Ascension has great significance for all of humanity. The Ascension does not mean Christ is now "some place far from people and from the world" as Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI explained. Rather, Christ has "led our human existence into God's presence, taking with him

flesh and blood in a transfigured form." This means everyone now "...find[s] room in God; through Christ, the human being was introduced into the very life of God. And since God embraces and sustains the entire cosmos. the Ascension of the Lord means that Christ... is now, thanks to his being with the Father, close to each one of us forever." (Homily, 7 May 2005)

Through baptism, all of us now enjoy this intimate fullness of life in this "embrace" of the Trinity we have received the promised "permanent outpouring of the Holy Spirit" and hence possess the "germ" of eternal life for us to grow and thrive in (Life Everlasting, Fr Reginald Garrigou-Lagrange, OP). We find the essence of this eternal life in today's gospel - a passage from Christ's longest

prayer called his "High-Priestly Prayer". Addressing the Father, Christ says, "...eternal life is this: to know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent." (Jn 17:3) Knowledge of who Christ is (Son sent by God) and what he has done (freely accepted the "hour" of his passion for man's salvation) have moved his disciples to submit to Jesus' Lordship as Jesus reveals in his prayer - they have "kept [God's] word" and "truly accepted" and "believed" in Christ (|n 17: 6 & 8).

This submission to the Father's saving plan and to his Son is how Jesus has been "glorified" in his disciples (Jn 17:10). Glorification and obedience to divine will are intertwined as Pope Emeritus explains, "The glorification that Jesus asks for himself...is the entry into full obedience to the Father...a total gift of himself on the Cross...the supreme act of love - he is glorified because love is the true glory, the divine glory." (General Audience, 25 Jan 2012)



"...eternal life is this: to know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent." (In 17:3)

The apostles huddled in fear in the Upper Room after Christ was lifted up on the cross and crucified. In today's first reading, the Upper Room after Christ was lifted up into heaven is a different picture. The apostles, other followers, several women and our Blessed Mother - 120 people in all were all "joined in continuous prayer." (cf Ac 1:14-15). They were fixed on the next stage of the Father's mission through his Son: the sending of the Holy Spirit to make them witnesses of Christ to the ends of the earth. Already then, they radiated the "glory" Christ told his Father they already possessed.

Today, virtually all the ends of the earth have heard of Christ but many still have not grasped how Christ's sacrifice has saved them and revealed the great love of the Father for humanity. This is the "Story of stories" says our Holy Father, Pope Francis, as we celebrate the 54th World Communication Sunday today. "The Bible is... the great love story

> between God and humanity. At its centre stands Jesus, whose own story brings to fulfilment both God's love for us and our love for God."

> As we also mark on our calendars today the 100th day since Masses were suspended on February 15 due to Covid-19, let us not forget that we still have church! "Stay home, stay safe" is also staying in love in our "domestic church" - the believing family where "life is to be completely centered on the lordship of Christ." (Pope Emeritus, Feb. 7, 2007) As we await a renewal in the Holy Spirit at Pentecost next Sunday, let us allow Christ's glory to shine through in our homes, any other civilly-permitted settings and on social media. By our prayers and loving sacrifices, may Christ's saving love move hearts and draw them into the Trinitarian embrace.

World Day of Social Communications: Tell Your Stories

Every year on the Sunday before Pentecost the Church celebrates the achievements of the communications media and focuses on how it can best use them to promote gospel values.

This Sunday is the 54th World Day of Social Communications and the theme chosen by Pope Francis, "So that you can tell your son and grandson" (taken from a passage in the Book of Exodus) shows the close link between memory and communications. The Exodus experience teaches us that knowledge of the Lord is handed down from generation to generation mainly by telling the story of how our Lord continues to make himself present.

Jesus told many stories or parables in the bible to communicate with his audience the power of the Kingdom of God. Some of these parables may seem simple but when these narratives are applied and change generated, one can truly witness the transformative powers of such stories.

Our lives create history. Pope Francis has emphasized in many of his speeches/writings that there is no future without being rooted in the lived history. Our memory is the means by which our stories, hopes, dreams and experiences are weaved into a common loom or passed on from one generation to another. This is not done in a solitary state but through interactions with others. To communicate therefore, is to connect memory with life through stories.

However, Pope Francis reminds us that it is not simply telling stories as such, or of advertising ourselves, but rather of "remembering who and what we are in God's

eyes, bearing witness to what the Spirit writes in our hearts and revealing to everyone that his or her story contains marvellous things."

Finally in his message, Pope Francis asks us to entrust ourselves to the one woman who pondered everything in her heart, wove together the events in her life and knit in her womb the humanity of God - our Mother Mary. His prayer to Our Lady the Undoer of Knots:



Mary, woman and mother, you wove the divine Word in your womb, you recounted by your life the magnificent works of God. Listen to our stories, hold them in your heart and make your own the stories that no one wants to hear. Teach us to recognise the good thread that runs through history. Look at the tangled knots in our life that paralyze our memory. By your gentle hands, every knot can be untied. Woman of the Spirit, mother of trust, inspire us too. Help us build stories of peace, stories that point to the future. And show us the way to live them together.

Do you know who is the Patron Saint of Communications?

Archangel Gabriel - because Gabriel delivers God's most important messages and helps people communicate with each other well. He interpreted the dreams of the prophet Daniel, told Zacharias that his wife Elizabeth would bear a son, and announced God's will for Mary - that she would bear the Son of God, lesus Christ.

Pope Francis, at the beginning of his pontificate, said this to the members of the press: "Your work calls for careful preparation, sensitivity, and experience, like so many other professions, but it also demands



a particular concern for what is true, good, and beautiful. This is something which we have in common, since the Church exists to communicate precisely this: Truth, Goodness, and Beauty 'in person.'"
