

Waiting for the Lord

First Sunday of Advent 29 Nov 2020

Is 63:16-17, 64:1, 3-8 1 Cor 1:3-9 Mk 13:33-37

In his essay "The World's Last Night", CS Lewis summarized the scriptural teaching on Jesus' coming in three propositions: "(1) That he will certainly return. (2) That we cannot possibly find out when. (3) And that therefore we must always be ready for him."

It is this state of readiness that our gospel passage speaks of when Jesus exhorts his disciples to "stay awake" (Mk 13:33); it is this same state of waiting and longing that we enter into as we begin the season of Advent and prepare for the Lord's coming at Christmas.

This longing is familiar to — in fact, characteristic of—our Jewish forefathers. Each Advent Sunday features a reading from Isaiah as he is the great prophet of the Messiah: in this Sunday's First Reading, the Jews are aware that they had "stray[ed]", that their hearts had "harden[ed]", and that they were "sinners" and "rebels". Yet, they still longed for the Messiah, for God to "come down." (Is 63:17, 64:4)

Similarly, even mired in worldliness and sin, even if the past year of humdrum busyness has eroded our prayer lives and our spiritual disciplines, we can long for the Lord (again). It is not only when we are close to God that we long for him; longing for him itself brings us

closer to him.

In an interview on the Martin Scorsese film Silence (2016), actor Andrew Garfield spoke of this "longing for love... in a time and a place where a life of joy and love is... impossible". To prepare for the film, Garfield had undergone a year of St Ignatius' Spiritual Exercises. As a young actor, he had brought to the Exercises a sense of his own inadequacy. He had been longing for something; he found someone.

"I had no relationship to [Jesus] beforehand...He was just the frontman for Christianity. [I was] pantheist, agnostic, occasionally atheist and a little bit Jewish, but mostly confused." The Spiritual Exercises brought an unexpected experience, "What was really easy was falling in love with this person, was falling in love with Jesus Christ. That was the most surprising thing... God! That was the most remarkable thing — falling in love, and how easy it was to fall in love with Jesus." Garfield said.

As we enter Advent this Sunday, perhaps we too feel inadequate, unprepared, or just distracted. The invitation is for us to wait for the Lord, to long for him, and then to fall in love again with him.

As poet David Whyte puts it:

"Longing is divine discontent, the unendurable present finding a physical doorway to awe and discovery that frightens emboldens, humiliates and beckons, makes us into pilgrim souls and sets us on some road that starts in the centre of the body, and then leads out, like an uncaring invitation, like a comet's passing tail, glimpsed only for a moment but making us willing to give up our perfect house, our paid for home and our accumulated belongings."

For Garfield, perhaps the most critical exercise was imagining himself as a midwife present during the Nativity, preparing for and waiting upon the birth of Christ. That exercise was a meditation not on Garfield's own inadequacies or wounds, but on the revelation of the sacred, on the vulnerability of God, on the Word made flesh.

Even as we take stock of our year and our lives as we prepare for Christmas, may we eventually turn our gaze from ourselves to our Lord, to wait and long for his coming, and to welcome him into the manger of our hearts again.




