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Freedom as Obedience & Service

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time 26 Jun 2022

1 Kgs 19:16. 19-21 Gal 5:1. 13-18 Lk 9:51-62

The Cambridge Dictionary defines freedom as "the condition or right of being able or allowed to do, say, think, etc. whatever you want to, without being controlled or limited." All of us cherish our personal freedoms but many of us also understand that some curbs to our freedom are necessary so that we can live harmoniously with others in a society that reflects human solidarity.

The Catechism affirms that man was created free. Man is a "rational [thinking] being...who can initiate and control his own actions." He is "master over his acts." (CCC1730) However, this gift of freedom from God makes man "a moral subject" – man's actions, "chosen in consequence of a judgement of conscience, can be morally evaluated. They are either good or evil." (CCC1749)

We all know that at the beginning of human history, Adam and Eve deliberately chose to disobey God. The prohibited "fruit" from "the tree of knowledge of good and evil" symbolised the limits of creatureliness that man must accept as he is created by God. Man did not come into existence by himself, he is totally dependent on God for his life. In that very first or original sin, Adam and Eve radically misused their God-given freedom, they "preferred [themselves] to God and by that very act scorned [God]." (CCC 398)


CCC 400 lists the consequences of Adam's sin: "the harmony [from] original justice, is now destroyed... the union of man and woman becomes subject to tensions...lust and domination. Harmony with creation is broken...the consequence [of death] explicitly foretold for this disobedience will come true... Death makes its entrance into human history." (CCC 400)

against historical this background of man's fall that we can understand why Jesus, in today's gospel, "resolutely took the road for Jerusalem." (Lk 9:51) Jesus was about to enter Jerusalem to accomplish his mission to die on the cross to save us. We reverently acknowledge this great love and mercy of God every Sunday in the creed when we bow and say, "For us men and for our salvation, he came down from heaven; and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man..." (CCC 456 -Why Did the Word Become Flesh?) The God whom Adam and Eve had scorned and disobeyed did not come to earth to take revenge on mankind for their rejection and centuries of sin. Rather, Christ became one of us to reconcile us with God, reveal to us God's love, be our model of holiness and make us "partakers of the divine nature." (cf CCC 456-460) That is why Jesus "rebuked" James and John for wanting to call down fire from heaven to burn up the Samaritan village which had refused to receive Jesus. After more than three years of following Jesus every day and seeing his way of compassion, mercy and forgiving love, they were still men of vengeance and violence. Pentecost, the Holy Spirit transformed them and their hearts burned with zeal and compassion to teach and change a sinful humanity. We have also received the Holy Spirit at our Baptism and Confirmation. In receiving the Holy Spirit, God has freed us from slavery of sin and

we must now live as transformed people "[serving] one another...in works of love." (Gal 5:13)

Emeritus Benedict encourages us to pattern our lives of freedom after Christ who "lived [his freedom] as a service...he 'filled' freedom with content, which would otherwise have remained an 'empty' possibility of doing or not doing something...Indeed, who is the freest? Someone who selfishly keeps all possibilities open for fear of losing them, or someone who expends himself 'firmly resolved' to serve and thereby finds himself full of life because of the love he has given and received?" (Angelus, 1 July 2007)

May we always choose to follow Christ, obeying God and *resolutely* loving and serving others that they may see God's love in us as we have seen God's love for us in Christ.



INFANT BAPTISM

Spiritual preparation is held on the last Friday of every odd month. Baptism is held on the first Sunday of the following month. For registration, please refer to our website.

FUNERAL

Please check with the Parish Office for priest availability and Mass timing before confirming the timing at the crematorium. For prayers at the wake, please contact the Parish Office.

MARRIAGE

Contact the Parish Office 12 months before your intended date to book the church premises and ensure that your presiding priest is able to make that date.

MASS OFFERING

Mass offering envelopes are available outside the Parish Office. Submit your envelopes at least two weeks in advance of your intended date. Please write the names clearly, and in block letters.
