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### The Good Shepherd, the Pastors and the Sheep

4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter (Good Shepherd Sunday) 21 April 2024

Acts 4:8-12 1 Jn 3:1-2 Jn 10:11-18

Sheep are silly, stubborn creatures. Do not think of them as cuddly, passive and obedient, content merely to graze passively at the green pastures that they are led to. No, they wander off in wrong directions to rocky cliffs and loose boulders, find themselves threatened by wild animals and marauders, and get themselves into all kinds of thickets and brambles. A shepherd's job, then, is not simply a matter of sitting idly on a rock playing his pipe. He must constantly be on guard to save his sheep - be it from their own foolishness or from external predators.


In this Sunday's Gospel, when Jesus proclaims himself as the Good Shepherd, he declares his constant vigilance and care for us, even as his disciples failed to stay awake with him at Gethsemane.

We can reflect on two further points. First, Adam was a gardener and a shepherd. In Genesis, the plants were not made insofar as "there was no man to till the ground" (Gen 2:5) and all creatures were brought to him to be named. As Ephrem the Syrian says, "the animals came to Adam as a loving shepherd."

Throughout the Old Testament, major biblical figures such as Abraham, Jacob, Moses and David were also shepherds. Just as Adam fell, so were these shepherds flawed and fallen. In fact, in biblical times, it was common for shepherds to be hired hands. Many villagers owned only a few sheep, and thus entrusted their animals to one shepherd to pasture the whole village flock. Jesus distinguishes himself from a mere "hired man" who "abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming" because the "sheep do not belong to him". Instead, Jesus claims us as his "own" whom he will "lay down [his] life for". Just as Jesus is the New Adam who redeems the fallen man, he is also the Good Shepherd who epitomises the pastor. CCC 896 thus states, "The Good Shepherd ought to be the model and 'form' of the bishop's pastoral office."

This leads us to the second point of reflection: the Church continues Christ's work of shepherding his flock. At the end of John's Gospel (Jn 21:15-17), Jesus instructs Peter - the rock on whom Jesus has built his church - to feed his lambs and tend his sheep. CCC 1564 holds, "in virtue of the sacrament of Holy Orders, after the image of Christ, the supreme and eternal priest, [priests] are consecrated in order to preach the Gospel and shepherd the faithful as well as to celebrate divine worship as true priests of the New Testament." Similarly, CCC 1465 states that in celebrating the Sacrament of Penance, "the priest is fulfilling the ministry of the Good Shepherd who seeks the lost sheep".

Good Shepherd Sunday is thus also known as Vocation Sunday. This Sunday, we celebrate our pastors who



have laid down their lives for us, their flock. And they have their work cut out for them. As St John Chrysostom reminded the Church, "The Lord said clearly that concern for his flock was proof of love for him." In his first Chrism Mass in 2013, Pope Francis also appealed to his fellow pastors, "This I ask you: be shepherds, with the 'odour of the sheep', make it real, as shepherds among your flock, fishers of men."

This Sunday, let us pray especially for our shepherds – that they may take on the odour of their sheep, no matter how stubborn and foolish we are, and that they, in turn, will be led by the Good Shepherd. Let us pray also for more vocations – for the harvest is plenty but the labourers are few. And let us pray for ourselves too – that the staff of the Good Shepherd will always comfort us through our valleys of darkness.

## Easter Vigil Baptism & Confirmation 2024

We continue to praise the Lord for the gift of Faith. Our newly baptised and confirmed brothers and sisters-in-Christ share more on their journeys towards baptism and confirmation.



"The journey towards baptism has been nothing short of transformative, shaping my understanding of faith, deepening my relationship with God, and strengthening my connection to the Catholic Church. At the start of this journey, I grappled with doubts, fears, and uncertainties about joining RCIA. I repeatedly questioned myself if I was truly ready for such a profound commitment, and whether I can amass enough knowledge of the Bible in a short span of nine months to call myself a Catholic.

The support and encouragement of the RCIA ministry were instrumental for my growth. Their prayers, guidance, and unwavering faith inspired me to carry on this path. It was a long process of introspection, prayer and seeking guidance from Christian friends and spiritual leaders. Through the weekly encounter, I gained a deeper understanding of the significance of baptism and the transformative power of God's grace.

One of the most profound aspects of my RCIA experience was the sense of belonging and community that I found within the group. We shared our life experiences without judgement, wrestled with doubts, and celebrated milestones together. The support and camaraderie helped me navigate challenges and deepen my commitment to living out my faith. I was finally not alone on this journey.

As I approached the culmination of the RCIA journey with the Rite of Christian Initiation, I felt a conflicting sense of gratitude and apprehension. The decision to be baptised was not an easy one; it was a conscious choice to declare my commitment to living a life aligned with my newfound beliefs and values. The act of baptism symbolised a moment of surrender, letting go of past burdens (fears and anxieties), and embracing a new beginning filled with hope and purpose.

Despite these struggles, I eventually found the courage and faith to move forward with my decision to be baptised. Looking back, I can now see that my struggles surrounding baptism were an essential part of my spiritual growth. They taught me valuable lessons about humility, trust and perseverance. My journey to baptism was not easy, but it was incredibly rewarding.

Today, I can proudly say that being baptised has brought immense peace into my life. I hope to encourage others who may be facing similar struggles — to trust in God's timing and embrace the journey with courage and faith."

I deeply appreciate the warmth and kindness shown by my godparent and secondary school form teacher, who wholeheartedly supported me in my decision to become Catholic, and were open to hearing about my experience and offered me advice. Throughout my journey, I have faced opposition from my Protestant family and have lost some friendships. I see these as crosses which God sends us to bear, especially new converts, in order to purify us from excessive attachment to creatures, necessary for us to love God above all, and adhere to his revelation without compromise.

For those who feel called to embrace the Catholic Faith, I want to assure you that it is indeed God who is calling you out of this world, to be in a relationship with him and his family in the Church, rooted in divine love. However this journey is not easy, as our Lord lived a life of complete self-giving, so too is this demanded of his disciples. We must be willing to renounce, no matter how deep in it is in our heart, what is opposed to God's will. God is calling us to renounce all these in our heart, so as to make way for himself, who alone can make man truly happy."
