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Living as New Creations

5th Sunday of Easter 18 May 2025

Acts 14: 21-27 Rev 21: 1-5 Jn 13: 31-35

🗇 very year during Lent, we E strengthen our resolve to walk closer to the Lord, so that when Easter comes around, we can emerge stronger in our faith and deeper in our relationship with Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour. This is also when new Catholics are born of the Spirit and begin their new life in Christ as his new creations. They, and all of us take (and retake) our Baptismal vows - to reject Satan and all his empty promises. We are an Easter people, because we have died to our old sinful selves and become God's new creations.

But, how are we living as new creations beyond the climax of Easter celebrations at Mass? If we are stumped with how to love deeper and forgive more, we can certainly take a leaf out of the unstoppable passion and courage of the early Church. In the First Reading, St. Paul and St. Barnabas travelled far and wide braving persecution, imprisonment, even death, to spread the Gospel, and their sure-footed steadfastness "put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith" (Acts 14:22).

If we think evangelising is difficult these days, let's be reminded that the apostles and their followers had to endure many hardships as



missionaries too. Through fervent prayer, detachment from worldliness through fasting, they boldly gave testimony to God's love and mercy in their lives (cf. Acts 14:23-25). They were only able to give witness to Christ's teachings and share their conversion stories through the grace of the Holy Spirit. As a result, how the Church grew!

News flash: Jesus gave us the Holy Spirit too, in the Sacrament of Baptism and Confirmation. How are we harnessing God's power within us to grow his Church as his new creations? "[H]ow [are we opening] the door of faith to the pagans" (cf. Acts 14:27)?

On our own strengths and intellect, we can do nothing. As the Spirit leads the Church, we need to open our hearts and minds to its direction and guidance. By keeping ourselves holy and pure, as worthy temples, and having an active relationship with the Spirit, we will be able to discern how God wants us to show his light to others as new creations. Daily Eucharist and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, meditating on the mysteries of Christ's most sacred life through the Rosary, praying with the Word through Lectio Divina, and fasting as a means to mortify our fleshly appetites, help us build a solid foundation of faith,

and nurtures our relationship with Jesus. We do this faithfully, and our lives will change because our hearts will change. We will become more and more like who we consume, converse with, and contemplate. Our hearts will slowly but progressively burn for Jesus, to bring more souls to him.

Doing so means we will receive the Lord's promise of "a new heaven and a new earth" (Rev 21: 1) in St. John's vision of the ultimate kingdom of God in the Parousia (Christ's Second Coming) in the Second Reading. There, in the New Jerusalem will also be where "[h]e will wipe away all tears from their eyes; there will be no more death, and no more mourning or sadness" (Rev 21: 4).

Indeed, the beatific vision and being in perfect communion with the Holy Trinity can be ours for eternity one day, for God's promises are certain. Where we are in our lives, imperfect yet hopeful, we continue to glorify God, our King, blessing his name forever (cf. Ps 144). We will give glory to God when we follow Jesus, who said to his apostles, "I give you a new commandment: love one another; just as I have loved you, you must also love one another" (Jn 13: 34).

Spend the weekend fruitfully, filling up your spiritual tanks in community with your brothers and sisters-in-Christ at this non stay-in retreat conducted by Rev Deacon Sherman Kuek. Deacon is now at the final set of mysteries -The Luminous Mysteries - in his series on the Rosary, so don't miss out on it! Three participants of the previous Parish Recollections share their testimonies below:



66 Deacon draws upon his very varied life experiences to flesh out the different mysteries. He shows how we can connect with those mysteries to pray our own unique circumstances through them. As a Protestant convert he shares through personal stories his own journey to the Catholic Church and how its traditions - like the rosary, shaped his own faith and continue to anchor his prayer life.

Engaging and frank, Deacon brings the words of Scripture to life. He shows how, in practical ways, we can enter more deeply into prayer. Meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, we are drawn to the mind and heart of our Lord which brings a new intimacy to our relationship with Him. The retreat offers us a fresh way, through this ancient devotion, to connect our lives with God, who is as present with us today as He was two thousand years ago.

As the late Pope Francis said, "this simple prayer... helps us to contemplate all that God in His love has done for us and for our salvation, and allows us to understand that our life is united to that of Christ. In prayer, we bring

everything to God, our struggles, our wounds, our fears, but also our joys, our gifts, our loved ones... all to God. By praying, we allow God to enter our time, to welcome and transfigure all that we experience. - Corinne Cheok

The previous parish recollections on the mysteries of the Holy Rosary were spiritually enriching for all who attended. The session we participated in focused on deepening our understanding of the Sorrowful and Glorious mysteries, inspiring us into a more contemplative prayerful life.

Deacon led us through each set of mysteries with biblical insights, historical context and practical reflections. These allowed us to connect the life of Christ and the Blessed Mother with our own daily struggles and joys in a deep personal way.

The recollection was warmly received and served as a reminder of the beauty, richness and transformative power of the Marian prayer.
